Maryland-breds among top sellers at Eastern Fall Yearling sale

Maryland-breds accounted for two of the top four prices at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale, held September 29 to October 1 at Timonium.

Selling for \$155,000—the third-highest price overall and the session leader on the first day—was a Maryland-bred colt by Silver Deputy out of Run for Joy (by Geiger Counter) consigned by Herb and Ellen Moelis's CandyLand and purchased by Scanlon Training Center.

Bred by the Moelises, whose CandyLand Farm is located in Middletown, Del., the chestnut colt was foaled at Country Life Farm in Bel Air, Md. He is the third foal out of multiple stakes winner Run for Joy, from the family of champion and successful sire Cozzene.

A Maryland-bred Songandaprayer colt sold for \$110,000—the second-highest price on the second day of sale. Consigned by his breeder, John P. McDaniel's Hickory Ridge Farm, with Sally Thomas as agent, the colt was purchased by Dapple Bloodstock. The dark bay is out of the Storm Bird mare Beach

Bunny, and is a half-brother to three winners. His second dam, the Secretariat mare Jewel in My Crown, is a half-sister to Canadian champion Regal Intention.

In line with the trend, a total of 92 Maryland-bred yearlings (from 189 cataloged) were sold, for an average of \$13,483, down 36 percent from last year's Maryland-bred average of \$21,226. The buyback rate for Maryland-bred yearlings was 42 percent.

A Not For Love colt consigned by Green Willow Farms topped all Maryland-sired yearlings on a bid of \$100,000. A Pennsylvania-bred, the dark bay colt was purchased by Vision Sales 2008 LLC. Out of the Silver Buck mare Silver Nova, he is a half-brother to stakes winner Tactical Move and stakes-placed Exemplary.

Not For Love—the sale's overall leading sire by gross—had 14 of his offspring sell for \$456,000.

Other Maryland sires with gross sales of more than \$50,000 were Domestic Dispute (19 sold, \$178,300), Lion Hearted (13 sold, \$177,400), Two Punch (five sold, \$104,000), Louis Quatorze (four sold, \$54,300) and Rock Slide (five sold, \$51,600).

The top first-year Maryland sires were Dance With Ravens (14 sold, \$102,300), Oratory (11 sold, \$90,500) and Gators N Bears (eight sold, \$69,700). 🐾

MJC security chief retires

Willie Coleman, the Maryland Jockey Club's vice-president of security, retired at the end of September after nearly 25 years with the organization.

During his tenure Coleman has had up to 180 employees on a day-to-day basis while managing Laurel Park, Pimlico and Bowie, and supervised a security force of 1,500 on Preakness day. Six hundred of the security guards are brought in from the Department of Corrections, Fort Meade and Aberdeen Proving Grounds and are called WC's after Coleman's initials.

Coleman, 69, will continue to work big events such as Preakness, Maryland Million and Virgin Festival on a consulting basis. Rick Anderson, Bob Vinci and Ira Williams will split Coleman's daily roles.

MHBA's Cindy Deubler honored as "unsung hero" of Maryland racing

Cindy Deubler, a long-time Maryland Horse Breeders Association (MHBA) employee and associate editor of the MHBA's award-winning *Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred* magazine, received the Maryland Racing Media Association's Unsung Hero award on September 26.

The award was presented at MRMA's annual crab feast at Laurel Park.

Deubler was cited for her knowledge, standards of excellence and unfailing willingness to give of her time and energy.

six years and took on a new role this spring as assistant trainer to her father, Howard Wolfendale.

2008: 1st \$50,000 Gin Talking S, 5½ fur. (off turf), registered Md.-bred 2-year-old fillies, Laurel, Sept. 6.

In the trail of Tropical Storm Hanna, a whirlwind roared down the track at Laurel Park.

Heavy rain forced the Gin Talking Stakes off the turf, and may have contributed to the short field of five starters, but Miss Charm City—making her second career start, fol-

lowing a four-length maiden special weight victory over a fast dirt surface on August 13—appeared oblivious to the elements. Taking command in mid-turn under Horacio Karamanos, the Carlos Garcia-trained filly widened her margin the remainder of the trip to score by six and three-quarters lengths.

Letmeaskuaquestion finished a game second, a half-length to the good of 1.9-1 favorite Graceful Ginger. Queen of Song and Bigdaddysgirl rounded out the order of finish. Final time was 1:06.87, and Miss Charm City paid \$7.60 as the bettors' third choice.

Miss Charm City became the first stakes winner for Bowman's Band, a popular though sadly fated son of Dixieland Band who launched his stud career at Maryland Stallion Station in Glyndon, Md., in 2005, and moved to Lane's End in Kentucky for the 2007 breeding season. Bowman's Band was euthanized this past August after suffering complications from colic surgery.

Much of Miss Charm City's success can be attributed to Garcia, and his wife, Carol Kaye-Garcia, who counted the filly's breeder, James Glenn, among their longtime clients. Glenn, a retired wholesale food distributor in Baltimore, died this past year at the age of 78; Miss Charm City cam-

paigns in the name of his estate.

Glenn purchased Miss Charm City's dam, Pam'ssummerwind (by Rodeo), privately as a young horse. After failing to hit the board in four career starts, Pam'ssummerwind was turned over to Kaye-Garcia at the couple's Wellington Park Stud in Woodbine, Md. It was Kaye-Garcia who selected the mating with Bowman's Band.

Miss Charm City is the first foal from the mare, who is a half-sister to 2005 champion Maryland-bred 2-year-old filly Celestial Legend (by City Zip) and stakes-placed Legendary Journey (by Not For Love).

Pam'ssummerwind has a yearling filly by St Averil, cobred in the name of Glenn and the Garcias' Kaygar Stable. She was not bred for 2008 because of Glenn's declining health, but is in foal to Domestic Dispute.

2008: 1st \$50,000 **Oliver's Twist S**, 5½ fur., turf, registered Md.-bred 2-year-olds, Laurel, Sept. 13; 2nd **Chenery S**.

William M. Backer's Mr. Keeper rose to the top of the local juvenile division with a convincing three-length score in the \$50,000 Oliver's Twist Stakes for Maryland-bred 2-year-olds at Laurel Park on September 13.

The Oliver's Twist (named for the Maryland-bred son of Horatius who finished second in the 1995 running of the Preakness) scratched down from nine to six starters. But the five and a half-furlong turf sprint turned out to be a roughly run contest, as Pilanesberg, the early leader, bolted entering the turn, carrying Helooklikearnold nearly the full width of the track.

Mr. Keeper, at that point several lengths back, moved between horses three-wide entering the stretch under jockey Malcolm Franklin and took command in midstretch before drawing off from the field.

Stone in Love finished a game second, followed by Essenceofthemoon, Helooklikearnold (who rallied after recovering from the incident on the turn), In the Juice and Pilanesberg.

Final time was 1:03.56 over a good course. Mr. Keeper, the actual second betting choice but listed at 8-5 odds along with Essenceofthemoon, paid \$5.20.

The winner and runner-up are both sons of Lion Hearted, as is the fourth-place finisher. Lion Hearted (by Storm Cat) stands at Northview Stallion

Station in Chesapeake City, Md.

Mr. Keeper, trained by Hamilton Smith, was making his third career start in the Oliver's Twist. He won at first asking, in a five and a half-furlong maiden special weight on the dirt at Colonial Downs on June 10, and came back to finish second in Colonial's July 26 Chenery Stakes, a five and a half-furlong turf event won by Captain Bry.

Mr. Keeper comes from a well-established family of runners, many of them foaled in Maryland and raised at Backer's Smitten Farm near Middleburg, Va.

Backer campaigned Mr. Keeper's granddam, Applause (by Shecky Greene), to win or place in 19 stakes, earning \$362,437 in the 1980s. Mr. Keeper's dam, Talent (1998, Cryptoclearance), is a half-sister to stakes winners Jazz (\$214,331, All Brandy S, etc.) and Favored Lady (\$113,285, Miss Liberty S, etc.).

Talent has produced two stakes performers from two foals. Her first foal, Broadway Baby, a 4-year-old daughter of Gilded Time, is a stakes-placed earner of \$146,091.

The mare has a yearling filly by Not For Love and a weanling filly by Horse Chestnut (SAf). She is in foal for 2009 to Belong to Me.

Foard Wilgis and David Picarello captured lightning in a bottle with Cherokee's Boy, their homebred son of Citidancer who won or placed in 28 stakes and earned \$1,177,946 during a career that spanned 48 starts and five seasons on the track.

Maryland-bred Horse of the Year in 2005, and a Maryland-bred divisional champion at ages 2 and 5, Cherokee's Boy is now at stud at Maryland Stallion Station in Glyndon. His first foals arrived this year.

Few acts are tougher to follow than that one. But Wilgis and Picarello—who breed and race under the banner of ZWP Stables—have come up with an encore in Wonder Mon, a 3-year-old Maria's Mon gelding who is the first foal from Cherokee's Boy's stakes-placed half-sister Runnin Wonder (by Chimes Band).

Wonder Mon prompted the ZWP partners and their trainer, Gary Capuano, to tentatively set their sights on the Triple Crown early this season. He went undefeated in his first two starts, including a six and a quarter-length romp in allowance company

on January 2 at Laurel Park. However, a winter campaign in Florida brought mostly disappointment. Wonder Mon fell ill after the trip and never regained his form.

Capuano, the Maryland-based trainer who 11 years ago saddled Captain Bodgit to finish second in the Kentucky Derby and third in the Preakness, returned Wonder Mon to his home state, where he finished out of the money in both the Private Terms and Federico Tesio Stakes. After a 20¼-length drubbing in an allowance race at Pimlico on May 3, his first attempt on turf, Wonder Mon was given a layoff, and gelded.

His return came in the Deputed Testamony Stakes, against fellow Maryland-bred 3-year-olds, on September 20. And once again, Wilgis and Picarello experienced the wonder of a stakes victory by a homebred.

After settling well behind the early pace, Wonder Mon made his move three-wide entering the stretch of the one-mile stakes, and drew off under a hand ride by Travis Dunkelberger, dominating his rivals by six and a quarter lengths.

Favorite Casanova Jack held on for second, a length and a quarter to the good of Malibu Kid. Completing the field were Blue's Baby Boy, Legendary Lover, Pearlman and Peter's Creek. Final time was 1:37.32. Wonder Mon paid



\$8.40 as the bettors' fourth choice.

Wilgis and Picarello began their career in horse ownership with Cherokee Wonder (by Cherokee Colony), who cost them \$5,500 as a yearling at the 1992 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed sale.

Under Capuano's care, Cherokee Wonder developed into a multiple stakes winner and graded-placed earner of \$284,005. Retired as a brood-

mare, Cherokee Wonder produced only two foals—Cherokee's Boy and Runnin Wonder—before her untimely death from colic after foaling a Citidancer colt in 2001; despite all-out efforts to save him, the foal survived only a few weeks.

Runnin Wonder, a three-time winner who finished second in the Heavenly Cause Stakes and third in the Carousel Stakes, earning \$79,100, is

one of two broodmares currently owned by ZWP.

Runnin Wonder's 2-year-old filly by Harlan's Holiday, Hogan Beach, was sold by her breeders for \$90,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sale. Resold at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March 2-year-olds in training sale for \$175,000, Hogan Beach races for Lael Stables and trainer Michael Matz. She swept to her first victory, a

four and three-quarter-length score, on October 1 at Laurel Park.

Boarded year-round at Jerry and Laurie Calhoun's Summer Wind Farm in Libertytown, Md., Runnin Wonder has a yearling Maria's Mon filly whom Wilgis and Picarello intend to keep and race. She did not produce a foal in 2008, and resorbed after being bred this season to Broken Vow.

POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE

WHAT IS MHBA'S PAC?

It is a **Political Action Committee** formed by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association. The PAC solicits voluntary contributions from individuals or corporations to support issues or assist selected candidates for public office in the state of Maryland who are interested in the problems of our industry and are willing to help us solve those problems.

WHY DO WE NEED PAC?

The largest market for horses bred in Maryland is horse racing, an industry that is closely regulated by state government. In addition, while not well understood, horse breeding is an especially important segment of Maryland agriculture. The economic well-being of racing and breeding is very much a function of the political process. It is essential to the health of our industry that we educate our elected officials and support those who work with us on issues vital to our interests.

HOW DOES PAC WORK?

The PAC receives voluntary contributions through its treasurer which are then disbursed to candidates or spent supporting issues as selected by a committee headed by the chairperson of the MHBA Legislative Committee. Any administrative expense will be paid by the MHBA. Reports of PAC contributions must be filed with the State Administrative Board of Election Laws and are a matter of public record.

WHAT ARE THE LAWS GOVERNING CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS?

No corporation or individual may give more than \$4,000 to a single candidate or more than \$10,000 to all candidates in any given four-year election cycle. Any contribution to the PAC must be included in your \$10,000 total for an election.

WHAT IS THE TAX STATUS OF MY CONTRIBUTION?

There are no deductions or credits allowed on your state tax returns but federal law permits a credit of 50 percent on total political contributions up to a \$50 credit (for a \$100 contribution) on individual returns, and a \$100 credit (for a \$200 contribution) on joint returns. Political contributions are not deductible business expenses.
