Meeting the board: Suzanne Moscarelli

The American dream came true for Suzanne Moscarelli. "I'm proof that it really can happen," says the 72-year-old lifelong horsewoman.

Suzanne Cove grew up on a 380-acre working farm in Oxfordshire, England, and traveled to the U.S. at age 21—driven by a yearning to "see the world." Her 4-H club in England had sponsored a contest for a trip to America. When Suzanne failed to win (she was first runner-up), she worked her way over on her own, making the journey on the Queen Mary.

Early in her career, Moscarelli made her mark with three-day event horses, the high point coming in 1963 when she rode Dorrie Shipp's Fire Cracker to top national honors.

Polo became a focus when, at age 35, she married her late husband, Vincent (Vinnie) Moscarelli, then the polo pro at Potomac Horse Center in Potomac, Md.

When Vinnie Moscarelli's arm wore out from more than 25 years in the strenuous sport, the couple settled down at a bucolic property—their original Country Roads Farm—in Charles Town, W.Va., in 1978, and turned to Thoroughbred breeding and racing.

Their achievements, in association with songwriter Burt Bacharach, were unparalleled in the state of West Virginia, as they foaled and raised Eclipse Award winner Heartlight No. One (a Maryland-bred) and Grade 1 winners Soul of the Matter and Afternoon Deelites (still the only two West Virginia-bred millionaires).

Notable runners from the Moscarellis' breeding program included Grade 1 winner A Huevo, Maryland Million Classic hero Evil Storm, and A Huevo's sire, Cool Joe, who won the 1987 Maryland Million Sprint and made his stud career at Country Roads.

The Moscarellis relocated Country Roads to Warwick (Cecil County), Md., in 1996,

in order to be closer to Delaware Park, where the bulk of their horses competed. Three months after the move, Vinnie Moscarelli suffered a fatal heart attack one afternoon at that track.

Suzanne Moscarelli has carried on with the help of their two grown children, Delaware Park-based trainer Vince Moscarelli, and Lisa Richter, who serves as book-keeper.

Still with a demanding workload, Moscarelli maintains an active commercial breeding and training center at Country Roads, boarding broodmares visiting stallions at nearby Northview Stallion Station and other farms in the area. She keeps about 10 mares of her own along with several horses in training.

Country Roads's most famous product in recent years has been Hot Story (by Two

Punch), dam of million dollar-earner and two-time steeplechase Eclipse Award winner Good Night Shirt, the 2008 Maryland-bred Horse of the Year.

Moscarelli, elected to her first term on the Maryland Horse Breeders Association board of directors in 2009, was instrumental in the creation of the West Virginia Thoroughbred Development Fund in the 1980s, and volunteered

many hours as longtime secretary of the West Virginia Thoroughbred Breeders Association.

Her varied experience has given her a "multi-dimensional" view of the industry, says Moscarelli, and convinced her that "we need to have a united front—breeders, horsemen and the track—all of us are striving for the same thing." 🐾

Vaughn Flannery exhibit at Liriodendron

Works by noted equine artist Vaughn Flannery, who spent the better part of his career on his Cockade Farm in Darlington, Md., are featured in an exhibition at the gallery of the historic Liriodendron Mansion in Bel Air.

Flannery's paintings included race horses, mares and

foals and scenes of the "sport of kings." His color palette shows strong, warm tones with definite delineation. Other images evoke Degas's racing scenes: close-up views of jockeys in silks on milling horses waiting for the tape to drop. Then there are pastoral scenes with an impression-

ist quality such as expansive views of broodmares and foals in pastures.

The best of Flannery's work consists of his behind-the-scenes slice of life paintings of race tracks and breeding farms. He painted numerous images from the life of the legendary Man o'

War toward the end of the great horse's days in Kentucky. Flannery also captured Big Red's famous groom and caretaker, Will Harbut, in many of the paintings. Quiet times at Saratoga Springs, N.Y., early morning works at Pimlico, the van area and young horses being readied for the annual yearling sale, also at Pimlico, horses being turned out or brought in for the evening at the great breeding farms in Kentucky—all these scenes and more were captured by Vaughn Flannery.

Fortunately, a core of collectors recognize and appreciate Flannery's work. Among them is noted Baltimore area interior designer Stiles T. Colwill, whose late father, Fred Colwill, was one of the jockeys pictured in Flannery's famous work "The Start of the Maryland Hunt Cup" in the collection of the Baltimore Museum of Art. Stiles Colwill's collection forms the nucleus of the Liriodendron exhibition. Other paintings are on loan from private collections throughout Maryland, Virginia and Pennsylvania. The show is curated by Jane Webb Smith, who has for the past seven years researched Flannery's life in a quest to create the definitive catalog of his works.

MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS



Poseidon's Warrior strikes at Monmouth Park

Cash is King LLC's Poseidon's Warrior, a Maryland-bred Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sales graduate, cruised past the leaders three-wide on the far turn en route to a striking seven-length win in the colts/geldings division of the \$200,000 NATC Futurity on September 26 at Monmouth Park.

The NATC Futurity, sponsored by the National Association of Two-Year-Old Consignors, is restricted to

2-year-olds who were catalogued at auction sales during 2010 and whose owners paid all nomination and sustaining fees.

The Robert E. Reid Jr.-trained Poseidon's Warrior broke sharply from the gate before settling in third down the backside behind dueling pacesetters Federal Exchange and Tell Tale Friend.

Around the far turn, the Speightstown colt rallied strongly outside the tiring frontrunners and continued on powerfully, stopping the timer at 1:10.55 for six furlongs.

"Usually he's a little slow breaking out of the gate, but today he broke running," said winning rider Frankie Pennington. "Around the three-eighths pole, he was pulling and wanted to start running early, so I had to keep him relaxed. Once I asked him, he ran on really well."

With the win, Poseidon's Warrior improved his career record to two wins from three starts with earnings of \$126,150.

Bred by David and JoAnn Hayden's Dark Hollow Farm and William Beatson, Poseidon's Warrior was sold for \$90,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale last May. Out of the Smarten mare Poised to Pounce, he is a half-brother to multiple stakes winners Play Bingo (\$455,240) and Quick 'n Smart (\$172,020) and multiple stakes-placed Rhythmn Master.

Easy Red is stakes winner on flat and over jumps

Easy Red, who won or placed in six stakes on the flat at ages 3 through 6 for owner/breeder Joseph Keelty's Dumbarton Farm, has made a successful transition to the steeplechase world.

The now 8-year-old gelding made a big move through the stretch to post a three-quarter-length win in the \$70,000 Metcalf Memorial

Novice Hurdle Stakes on September 25 at Monmouth Park, covering the two and a quarter miles in 4:28.52 for trainer Tom Voss.

"I rode him Wednesday morning and he felt great," said winning jockey Brian Crowley. "They didn't go very quick early. I thought they'd be going faster. He relaxed well during the race. When I started to ask him to gain speed he quickened and I knew at the final home we were going to win it."

Easy Red broke his steeplechase maiden at Monmouth on September 26, 2009. Last out he took an allowance race over jumps on September 2 at Saratoga.

September 25 was a big day for the 88-year-old Keelty, whose Sharps Island won the lead-off event at Shawan Downs. The 7-year-old son of Deputy Minister, also trained by Tom Voss, got up in the final steps to capture the maiden event.

In 52 starts, Easy Red (by Charismatic) has seven wins, 10 seconds, 11 thirds, and earnings of \$356,812. He is the only stakes winner for his dam, Dreams of Glory (by Seattle Slew).

"This just goes to show what these classy older horses can do later in their careers," said Don Litz, Keelty's longtime bloodstock adviser.

Buckingham Farm's homebred Fascinatin' Rhythm separated from the pack with three furlongs to go and galloped to victory in the \$50,000 Geisha Stakes for Maryland-bred fillies and mares on September 11, opening day of the fall meeting at Laurel Park.

Confidently handled by apprentice Forest Boyce for trainer Dickie Small, the daughter of More Than Ready was winning her second straight stakes at Laurel. She captured the Jameela Stakes over the turf on August 14. Blind Date, who was second choice in the wagering, rallied to take second, a length behind the winner. Post time favorite Love's Blush finished third, followed by Sterling Vow and Ysabel T.

"We didn't necessarily want to be all the way out there but nobody was going so we went with what we had," Boyce said. "I figured I had to sit up there and wait as long as I could and then make my run."

This was also the first stakes winner for Boyce, who topped the jockeys' standings during the Laurel summer meeting. (See Newsmaker profile of Boyce on page 30.)

Fascinatin' Rhythm, who completed the mile in 1:37.14, began her career with three wins in her first five starts and finished third in the Grade 2 Barbara Fritchie Handicap in February 2009 but went 20 months between trips to the winner's circle before winning the Jameela.

"What happens a lot is that horses often are flat during their 4-year-old seasons," said Small. "That is what happened to her. She ran well

in the Fritchie when she just turned 4. Then the water got deep because she was out of conditions and running against older fillies and mares. The races are strong but if you can keep them healthy eventually they catch back up."

The 5-year-old mare is now 6-for-23 lifetime with 15 in-the-money finishes.

Fascinatin' Rhythm comes from an illustrious family going back several generations at Binnie Houghton's Buckingham Farm in Chestertown, Md. Her stakes-winning dam, April Gator (\$101,034, Cincinnati Trophy S, etc.), bred by Houghton's late father, Anderson Fowler, is a daughter of Fowler's homebred Green Alligator, the Gate Dancer colt who carried Fowler's colors to a fourth-place finish in the 1991 Kentucky Derby-G1. Fowler bred and raced Green Alligator's stakes-winning dam, La Reine Rouge (by King's Bishop), and sold her in 1984 when cutting back on his horse holdings; she went on to gain worldwide note as the granddam of 2006 Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro.

April Gator's dam, Don't Be Foolish (by Caveat), was a stakes-placed earner of \$79,170 as well as the dam of multiple stakes winner and multiple graded-placed Foolish Pole (\$445,849).
