Meeting the board: Donald Barr

Breeder . . . owner . . . trainer . . . bloodstock agent. Donald Barr, 70, has been all those and more during a lifelong career in the Thoroughbred industry.

One of Maryland's long-established public trainers, Barr currently maintains about 20 horses at Laurel Park, where the star of his stable is Lindy Redding's \$980,522-earner Ravallo, an 11-time stakes winner being aimed for a repeat victory in the Maryland Sprint Handicap-G3 on this year's Preakness day.

In all, Barr has trained at least 35 stakes horses, including additional multiple stakes winners Who Wouldn't, Purple Passion, G. O'Keefe and Merengue and Maryland Million stars Sweet Bunny and The Ruler's Sister.

A native of New England, Barr was introduced to racing as a fan at Lincoln Downs in Rhode Island. "I always liked animals and sports," he said. "It was either become a coach or a horseman."

He attended Clark University and graduated from Worcester Junior College before gravitating toward the track, and settled in Maryland more than 30 years ago.

Since 2003, he and his partner, veterinarian Carol Swandby, have operated a layup facility at Gray Swan

Farm, in New Market (Frederick County), where they also make their home.

"I enjoy all aspects of working with horses," Barr said. "Every year is a new year—you're always looking toward tomorrow."

Appointed to the MHBA board in 2010 to fill a vacancy left by departing board member Sally Thomas, Barr believes Maryland has fallen behind other states in supporting those who breed Thoroughbreds for the track.

And he is seeking several changes.

"We've got to raise the value of Maryland-breds, in order to keep breeders in business," he said. "Where would racing in this state be without the farms that supply the horses?"

A program of restricted races for state-breds would go a long way toward improving the bottom line for breeders, in Barr's view. "It would give Maryland-breds a chance to win an extra race or two," he commented.

Barr is also pressing for revisions in Maryland's claiming rules. "The rules as they stand right now are favorable to those who operate a claiming stable, but the breeders have been left behind," he said. "The breeder incurs all the expense of bringing a horse to the races, and someone can step in and claim that horse the very first time he runs. The pendulum needs to swing back the other way, so that the breeder has some advantage."

Adds Barr: "Racing is not the same business that I became involved in all those years ago. In many ways, we haven't fully recognized the implications of the changes. Breeders and horsemen need to work together to find ways to make it sustainable for everyone."

Maryland Equine Census reflects scope of industry

According to the 2010 Maryland Equine Census, there were 79,100 horses, ponies, mules, donkeys and burros in the state of Maryland on May 1, 2010, down 9 percent from the 87,100 on hand in 2002. Light horse breeds accounted for 50 percent of the total followed by race horse breeds with 37 percent of the total.

The two largest equine counties in terms of inventory were Baltimore and Montgomery at 8,950 and 7,900 head, respectively.

The value of the equine inventory on May 1, 2010 was \$714 million, up 5 percent from 2002. There were a total of 16,040 equine places throughout Maryland, down 21 percent from 2002. This

includes boarding facilities, commercial and private breeding places, farms, commercial race related places as well as private residences where equines are kept for recreational purposes. These equine operations accounted for a total of 587,000 acres, of which 188,000 acres were devoted to equines.

The value of all equine-related assets totaled \$5.6 billion including the value of the inventory, up 8 percent from 2002. The value of land, fencing and buildings made up 74 percent of the total assets and the value of inventory accounted for 13 percent of the total assets. Total equine related expenditures spent in Maryland in calendar year 2009 amounted to just under

\$513 million of which 71 percent were operating expenditures and 29 percent were capital expenditures. Total equine expenditures are down 33 percent from 2002.

"These data show the significant value and size of the equine industry in Maryland and serve as confirmation of the economic importance of this viable industry to the state," said Governor Martin O'Malley. "We are committed to fostering Maryland's equine industry and doing all we can to protect the thousands of jobs that depend on our rich history of horse racing and recreational riding."

"Governor O'Malley has taken a keen interest in Maryland's equine industry and this census validates its vibrant economic and cultural importance," said Jim Steele, chair of the Maryland Horse Industry Board and manager of Shamrock Farms in Woodbine. "The numbers reflect what we expected to see based on the current economic climate. The data show the importance of the industry as a whole from race horses to the pleasure-riding segment."

The 2010 equine census is the second official count of all breeds (horses, ponies, donkeys, mules and burros) in Maryland. The first census results were announced in 2002. The Maryland Horse Industry

Board commissioned the USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service field office in Annapolis to conduct both efforts. The most recent census is a more in-depth questionnaire that collected new information including labor and wages and a breakdown of equine-related expenditures by category (capital, operating).

"The results of the 2010 Maryland Equine Census help illustrate growing trends throughout the industry, both at the county and state level," said Barbara Rater, State Director of the USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service's Maryland Field Office in Annapolis. "It shows the economic scope and importance of the industry in Maryland."

Census forms were mailed in April 2010 to more than 24,000 potential equine owners and stable operators in all segments of the industry from racing to recreational riding. The census asked for information on the sale of horses, land area allocated to equine uses, number of horses owned, expenditures, and value of assets.

MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS

Ice Mist carries Maryland banner in Texas

Ice Mist, a 4-year-old Forest Danger filly from a distinguished family of Maryland-breds, joined the ranks of stakes winners with a front-running two-length victory in the \$50,000 Jersey Lilly Stakes, at a mile and a sixteenth on the turf, on February 5 at Sam Houston Park.

Bred by the Bender family's Glade Valley Farms Inc. and sold for \$30,000 at the 2008 Keeneland September Yearling sale, Ice Mist is owned by Naveed Chowhan

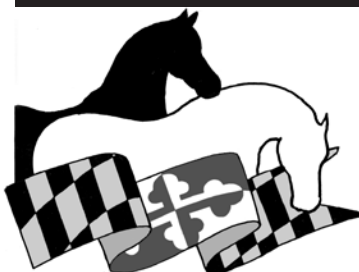
and trained by Bernard Flint. She won or placed in eight of her 11 starts at 3 last season, including a second-place finish in the Grade 3 Valley View Stakes at Keeneland. The stakes win boosted her career earnings to \$147,871.

Ice Mist is the third foal and first stakes winner from her dam, Maryland Mist (by Cozzene), who is a half-sister to stakes winners Foufa's Warrior (\$555,920, Kent Breeders' Cup S-G3, etc.), Maryland Moon (\$420,223), Full Brush (\$412,082), Certantee (\$278,760) and Media Access (\$211,372).

- *Renovating Pastures for a Thicker Grass Stand*, April 21, 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Your pastures may be green, but is your grass stand as healthy as it can be? Learn how to assess whether a renovation would benefit your pasture and how to increase the growth you've already established.

- *Using Pasture to Reduce Feed Costs*, May 26, 6 p.m.

to 8 p.m. Horses are natural grazers and under the right conditions a healthy pasture can provide all the nutrition a horse needs. Learn how to use pasture to its full potential and keep those extra dollars in your pocket.

—IN MEMORIAM— Gordon Kirwan

Carl Gordon Kirwan Jr., a longtime member of the Howard County-Iron Bridge Hounds, died on February 8 at the age of 84.

A native of Baltimore, Mr. Kirwan attended McDonogh School and the University of Maryland, College Park.

He served with the Army Air Forces during World War II, and after the war, joined the Marine Corps Reserves.

He worked for the Baltimore Convention Bureau and U.S. Industrial Chemicals Co. before moving in

1960 to Intercoastal Paint Co., where he was a marine specialist.

In 1972, he established ADCOA—Adhesive and Coating Associates—in Woodbine, which specialized in manufacturing marine and industrial paints and adhesives. He retired and closed the business in 2000.

His main avocation was restoring and driving vintage automobiles.

Survivors include his wife of nearly 60 years, the former Mary Vaeth.
