## Question 7 and the Maryland Horse Industry

### 2012 Maryland General Election Ballot Question

#### Question 7: Gaming Expansion Referendum (Ch. 1 of the Second 2012 Special Session) Gaming Expansion

*Do you favor the expansion of commercial gaming in the State of Maryland for the primary purpose of raising revenue for education to authorize video lottery operation licenses to operate "table games" as defined by law; to increase from 15,000 to 16,500 the maximum number of video lottery terminals that may be operated in the State; and to increase from 5 to 6 the maximum number of video lottery operation licenses that may be awarded in the State and allow a video lottery facility to operate in Prince George's County?*

After reviewing a report from the Gaming Task Force and much debate among legislative leaders and the Governor's office, and finally at a second Spe-

cial Session, General Assembly members took on the plan to expand gambling opportunities in Maryland. Ultimately after passing Senate Bill 1, the question would be put to state-wide referendum for the voters to decide. This question addresses whether to add table games at all existing slots facilities in Maryland, and offers the possibility of adding another site—"a destination location" as the commercials describe it—in Prince George's County. This potential new site will be lucrative for all of those involved, and it has generated a fierce competition between the supporters and the opponents, a battle that has played out on television and cost millions of dollars.

Though the introduction of table games and a Prince George's site are the most obvious changes in the bill that passed, there are other changes: to the tax rate, to the ownership of the slot machines and to the revenue dedicated to the horse

industry. The legislature reviewed the current system and decided that some adjustments were needed and is sending the most dramatic changes to the voters for approval.

As for how the bill might affect the horse industry, opinions vary. Racing will not see a share of any revenue generated by table games, and could see income decrease if gamblers migrate from slots to other forms of gambling. On the other side of the aisle, racing could benefit from additional slot machines in the state and could also get a boost from a sixth casino location.

"It's not a game-changer," said Senator Barry Glassman of District 35 in Harford County. "We watched it develop to make sure that it protected the horse industry and we did not get hurt. We held our own and the horsemen got

to present a unified opinion on it which was important."

Question 7 has caused an advertising battle ultimately funded by casino interests—Las Vegas-based MGM Resorts International (pro) and Penn National Gaming (con)—though neither is named. MGM hopes to run the proposed casino in Prince George's County while PNG wants to protect its gambling interests in West Virginia (Charles Town) and Maryland (Hollywood Casino at Perryville and Rosecroft Raceway).

In reality the horse industry will feel some impact, whether the referendum passes or not. Long-term effects to the industry won't be known for some time, but the General As-

sembly determined the changes to be manageable.

As history continually reminds, it pays to anticipate the consequences and it is important to note that the horse industry in Maryland is beginning to rebound and there is a sense of optimism again.

As reported at the September Maryland Racing Commission (MRC) meeting, Senate Bill 1 includes the following points:

**Section 1** (took effect Oct. 1, 2012), includes items that affect racing—

- Reduction in the Racing Facility Redevelopment Fund (RFRF) percentage from 2.5 percent to 1.75 percent.

- When Baltimore City is issued a VLT license the RFRF is reduced to 1 percent and the cap is reduced

to \$20 million from \$40 million annually.

- Clarifies the length of time (16 years) revenue from each VLT facility is applied to the RFRF.


- Allows the MRC to use the services of a certified public accountant when a licensee requests funds from the RFRF, and requires the track licensee to pay for those services.

**Section 9** requires each licensee eligible to receive funding from the RFRF on or before Feb. 1, 2013, to submit to the MRC and Department of Budget and Management a preliminary capital improvement plan. The plan shall include a description of the preliminary capital improvements, preliminary project schedule and an estimate of the funding to be required. If a

licensee's plan is not submitted by Feb. 1, 2013, any funding that would otherwise be available to that licensee shall be paid to the Education Trust Fund.

**Section 2** takes effect if the Maryland residents vote to support a sixth casino in Prince George's County and table games. No racing related items are in this section.

**Section 3** takes effect contingent on the award of a VLT license to a facility in Prince George's County—effect on racing related items, and reduces the amount to the purse dedication account from 7 percent to 6 percent.

**Section 5** requires a majority of Prince George's County voters to approve the sixth casino. 



### WHAT IS MHBA'S PAC?

It is a **political action committee** formed by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association. The PAC solicits voluntary contributions from individuals or corporations to support issues or assist selected candidates for public office in the state of Maryland who are interested in the problems of our industry and are willing to help us solve those problems.

### WHY DO WE NEED PAC?

The largest market for horses bred in Maryland is horse racing, an industry which is closely regulated by state government. In addition, while not well understood, horse breeding is an especially important segment of Maryland agriculture. The economic well-being of racing and breeding is very much a function of the political process. It is essential to the health of our industry that we educate our elected official and support those who work with us on issues vital to our interests.

### HOW DOES PAC WORK?

The PAC receives voluntary contributions through its treasurer which are then disbursed to candidates or spent supporting issues as selected by a committee headed by the chairperson of the MHBA Legislative Committee. Any administrative expense will be paid by the MHBA. Reports of PAC contributions must be filed with the State Administrative Board of Election Laws and are a matter of public record.

### WHAT ARE THE LAWS GOVERNING CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS?

No corporation or individual may give more than \$4,000 to a single candidate or more than \$10,000 to all candidates in any given four-year election cycle. Any contribution to the PAC must be included in your \$10,000 total for an election.

### WHAT IS THE TAX STATUS OF MY CONTRIBUTION?

There are no deductions or credits allowed on your state tax returns but federal law permits a credit of 50 percent on total political contributions up to a \$50 credit (for a \$100 contribution) on individual returns, and a \$100 credit (for a \$200 contribution) on joint returns. Political contributions are not deductible business expenses.

### Charged Cotton

**2012:** 1st \$100,000 All Brandy S, 1½ mi., turf, registered Md.-bred fillies and mares, 3 & up, Laurel, Sept. 15.

Sagamore Farm's homebred Charged Cotton, one of two 3-year-olds in the field of 10 registered Maryland-bred fillies and mares, left the starting gate as the 7-5 favorite and proved up to the task, rallying to score by 1¼ lengths in the \$100,000 All Brandy Stakes at Laurel Park Sept. 15.

The lightly raced daughter of Dehere, making her stakes debut under Horacio Karamanos, stalked the pace from fifth before swinging three wide into the stretch and overtaking front-runner Daydreamin Gracie, then holding off a late surge by longshot Grant Park. Daydreamin Gracie finished third, followed by Access to Charlie, Baltimore Belle, Cross Mountain, Broad

Contour, Queen Chatanika, Hausen (the other 3-year-old in the race) and Dream Louise.

Charged Cotton, trained by Ignacio Correas IV, completed 9 furlongs over firm turf in 1:47.05.

"She had some behavior problems," said Correas. "We worked hard. It's nice to have a homebred who is a stakes winner. She only has room to improve and I think she has a nice future in front of her."

Racing exclusively on the turf, Charged Cotton improved her record to three wins in five starts. She has earnings of \$102,770.

"She showed us she had talent and there was something there," added Correas. "But she can be difficult to work with. She tells us what she likes and we adapt."

Charged Cotton is out of the Broad Brush mare Lightning Lydia, a full-sister to multiple Grade 1 winner Schossberg who was purchased by Sagamore Farm for \$57,000 at the 2007 Keeneland November sale while in foal to Congrats. That foal, named Go Maire Tu, finished third in the 2010 Maryland Juvenile Championship Stakes and has earned \$123,402.

After producing Walkwithapurpose, a filly by Candy Ride (Arg), in 2010, Lightning Lydia was sold for \$20,000 at the 2010 Keeneland November sale while in foal to Broken Vow. Walkwithapurpose finished third in her career debut Sept. 2 at Timonium.

**2012:** 1st \$85,000 Thirty Flags S, 6 fur., turf, 3-year-old fillies, Belmont, May 2; \$60,000 Crank It Up S, 5½ fur., turf, 3-year-old fillies, Monmouth, June 9; \$100,000 Jameela S, 6 fur., turf (ncr—1:07.45), registered Md.-bred fillies and mares, 3 & up, Laurel, Sept. 5; 2nd The Very One S, Lady Charles Town S.

It was a marvelous way to open the fall meet at Laurel Park. Jazzy Idea, the speedy Great Notion filly owned, bred and trained by Edwin Merryman, thrashed her elders by 3 lengths in the \$100,000 Jameela Stakes Sept. 5. And she put an exclamation point on the win by breaking a 5-year-old course mark when getting 6 furlongs in 1:07.45 over firm turf.

Ridden by Luis Garcia, the 3-year-old filly went to post as the even-money favorite against eight other Maryland-

bred fillies and mares, including stakes winners Colony Club and Bold Affair. Breaking from the inside, she was taken back and rated patiently behind a quick early pace of :22.61 and :44.92.

"I knew we got a really nice horse so there isn't any reason to get in trouble so I just let the speed go and asked her from the three-sixteenths until the end," said Garcia. "I never thought she would run that 1:07. This was fun. I have ridden a lot of good horses but this filly is something else. When I asked her she was as strong as any I have been aboard."

Colony Club finished second, a neck in front of Queen Chatanika. Carole's Love was next, followed by Thisdanseistaken, Bold Affair, Calliope, Purely Love and Gin Sweep.

Jazzy Idea got her third stakes win of 2012, all on turf. She won the Thirty Flags at Belmont Park in May and followed with the Crank It Up at Monmouth Park in June. The Jameela was her seventh finish of first or second in 10 starts. Her only off-the-board finishes came at Saratoga in the Grade 1 Prioress and Grade 1 Test, her two starts prior to the Jameela, and the Charles Town Oaks in late September. She has career earnings of \$303,410 from 16 starts (through Sept. 22).

"Never disappoints, even at Saratoga. I wish Luis was on her up there," said Merryman. "She's just something else. I believe she's as good on the dirt as she is on the grass."

### Bayonne extends family's stakes tradition in Pink Ribbon

Jeffrey Cramer knew Bayonne's family and history, and was more than willing to put up \$6,250 to claim the just-turned 4-year-old Dance With Ravens filly out of a Penn National claiming race Jan. 19.

"We knew when we claimed her she had a hole in her somewhere. She is a sister to Eighttofasttocatch. Based on that family line they mature slow, so we weren't worried about her," said Cramer.

Bayonne rewarded Cramer with a stirring stretch drive to capture Charles Towns' \$70,000 Pink Ribbon Stakes on the evening of Sept. 22. Settled well back in the nine-horse field, she produced her run under Erik Ramirez with a half-mile to go and wore down favorites Withgreat-pleasure and Moonlit Malibu to win by a length. She completed 7 furlongs in 1:25.40, and added \$40,740 to her bankroll, which now stands at \$142,790 from 17 starts.

Riding a three-race win streak, Bayonne has been third or better in seven of her eight starts this year. The Pink Ribbon is her first stakes win.

Cramer noted that following the claim, "We gave her 60 days first time and she didn't respond well so we gave her another month and changed her running style. Once we put Erik (Ramirez) on and took ahold of her head, she was able to settle and the rest is all on her. She's able to stay more sound now because she isn't tiring out on the front end."

Bayonne is the third stakes winner out by the Nice Catch mare Too Fast to Catch. In addition to producing five-time stakes winner Eighttofasttocatch, an earner of \$470,690, Too Fast to Catch is the dam of Storm Punch, who was a stakes winner at 2 and stakes-placed in five races, including a third in the Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash-G1.

Bred by David and JoAnn Hayden's Dark Hollow Farm and Graham and Anita Motion's Herringswell Stable, Bayonne is the next-to-last foal out of her dam, now a pensioner at Dark Hollow.

### Madame Girya pads win streak with stakes score at Belmont

Nutmeg Stable's Madame Girya extended her win streak

to four by taking her stakes debut, Belmont Park's \$80,000 Smart N Fancy Stakes for 3-year-old fillies by a handy 2½ lengths Sept. 12.

Boasting an international pedigree, Madame Girya has found her calling sprinting on the turf. It took her five tries to break her maiden, but that win came in her second sprint start, at 6 furlongs on the grass at Belmont July 6. She completed the distance in 1:08.34. Since then, she's been undefeated.

On Aug. 4 at Saratoga, Madame Girya won a first-level allowance, getting 5½ furlongs in 1:02.42. Twenty days later, she won a non-winners of two other than allowance at the same distance, scoring handily in 1:01.86.

Sent off as the 2.20-1 favorite in the seven-horse field for the Smart N Fancy, Madame Girya applied similar tactics to her previous winning efforts. She rated just off the pace under Eddie Castro, rallied wide around the turn, took command in the stretch and held off all challengers. Her final time for 6 furlongs was 1:07.98.

Trained by Cam Gambolati, Madame Girya is a daughter of Irish-bred Santa Anita Derby-G1 winner Castledale (a son of Peintre Celebre) out of Ballet Partner (GB), by First Trump. She was bred by Raintree Thoroughbred Farm Inc., a Towson, Md.-based racing partnership headed by founder Russell C. Schalk Jr.

Schalk purchased Ballet Partner at the 2000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May 2-year-olds in training sale for \$19,000. She proved to be a solid allowance filly, winning five of 22 starts for Raintree Racing, and earning \$137,350. In her only stakes appearance, she finished fifth in the Carousel Stakes at Laurel as a 3-year-old. Madame Girya is Ballet Partner's fourth and final foal, and her only winner.

Unraced at 2, Madame Girya has earned \$206,280 from eight starts.

### Delaunay takes down heavy favorite in Temperence Hill Stakes

Delaunay, a 5-year-old son of champion sprinter Smoke Glacken, recorded the first stakes win of his career at Churchill Downs in June. He got his second by defeating a rising sprint star in Louisiana Downs' \$50,000 Temperence Hill Stakes Sept. 8.

Facing heavy 1-5 favorite Gantry, who had earned an automatic berth into the Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1 off a win in the Grade 2 Smile Sprint Handicap in July, Delaunay took charge from the break and was never headed. He held Gantry safe through the stretch and won by 2 lengths, getting 6 furlongs in 1:10.02.

Maggi Moss and trainer Tom Amoss claimed Delaunay for \$40,000 at Churchill Downs May 12. That was the fifth time the gelding had changed hands in six starts in 2012.

He began the year with his breeder, Robert Meyerhoff's Fitzhugh LLC, and trainer Dickie Small, but was claimed out of a fourth-place effort in January at Laurel Park by Jamie Ness. The gelding was also taken by trainers Hugh McMahan and Dane Kobiskie during the winter and early spring.

Delaunay is the second foal out of stakes winner Perilous Night (by Coronado's Quest), who was bred by Meyerhoff, as was Delaunay's second dam, graded stakes winner and \$405,284-earner Broad Smile. The bay gelding improved his career record of 34-9-8-3 for earnings of \$309,100.
