## Brushed by greatness

*Maryland Juvenile Championship winners  
carry on Broad Brush tradition*

**A**lpha Mike Foxtrot and Walkwithapurpose have more in common than their victories in the 2012 Maryland Juvenile Championship Stakes at Laurel Park for their respective genders. Both can claim the redoubtable Broad Brush as their maternal grand sire.

"Broad Brush is one of those gifts that keep on giving," said Richard Small, who trained the Robert Meyerhoff homebred in the mid-1980s. Small now conditions Alpha Mike Foxtrot, a gelded son of Two Punch out of Shashobegon, whom he bred with Tom and Chris Bowman.

Called "Mike" around the barn, the victor in the \$100,000 Maryland Juvenile Championship Dec. 29 made nine starts during his 2-year-old season and won twice while finishing second three times and third twice. He is owned by Larry Knight Jr. and his wife, former jockey Andrea Seefeldt.

"Andrea won 23 stakes races when she was riding for me. She even won a race on this horse's grandmother, Kimonina (two actually, in 1992)," said Small. "So there are a whole bunch of things that are kind of neat about this

horse and they go a long way back, even past Broad Brush."

Broad Brush was a Maryland legend—winning 14 of 27 lifetime starts, capturing four Grade 1 stakes and earning more than \$2.6 million. As a sire at Gainesway Farm in Kentucky, he led the country in 1994. His son Concern won the 1994 Breeders' Cup Classic-G1 and his daughter Farda Amiga won the 2002 Alabama-G1 and Kentucky Oaks-G1 and earned an Eclipse Award as the nation's best 3-year-old filly. Pensioned in June 2004, he died two years later at 26.

Small said that he thought Broad Brush would be an excellent broodmare sire because of his pedigree (Ack Ack—Hay Patcher, by Hoist the Flag) but it took quite a while before the trainer and the Bowmans got the results they had hoped for.

“The grandmother of this horse (Alpha Mike Foxtrot) was the first decent horse we had, and we had a lot of horses before her but they were forgettable. She’s the first one that Tom and I had that was any count and we kept her to breed,” Small said. “The mare (Kimonina’s daughter, Shashobegon) had quite a few foals but they all sort of had holes in them. Then this little fella came along and he’s been absolutely delightful for us.”

Alpha Mike Foxtrot isn’t the biggest, strongest or fastest horse Small has worked with, but he said the gelding has plenty of grit and always tries the best he can. He certainly proved that while winning the Maryland Juvenile Championship, where he encountered trouble but still kicked clear late to cover 7½ furlongs on a sloppy track in 1:34.51 under Forest Boyce. Sent off at nearly 10-1, the winner outran Hanky Doodle and Peeds in a Pod late, with favorite Lunar Rock a

well-beaten sixth in the field of nine state-breds.

“He got bounced around at the start and that made him mad. But then all the way down the backside, he got boxed in with horses all around him and there wasn’t anything he could do. He tried to get out of there and he couldn’t,” Small said. “Forest did an amazing job of keeping him from running up on horses’ heels and then letting him run after he did get out. Most young horses would have said ‘to hell with this.’ She gets a million gold stars for that ride.”

Boyce also got her 100th win of 2012 in that race, after getting 99 in 2011, and that especially pleased Small.

“That part was pretty neat, too, because she pretty much grew up in my barn and worked for me for a really long time before she started riding,” Small said. “There are a whole bunch of neat story lines where this horse is concerned.”

Alpha Mike Foxtrot will get a chance to prove himself in tougher company as Small will target open races for the horse’s sophomore schedule.

### Walk like a winner

Trainer Ignacio Correas IV had the same thoughts for

Sagamore Farm homebred Walkwithapurpose after she won the \$100,000 Maryland Juvenile Filly Championship Dec. 31. Moved to the year’s final day due to a weather cancellation, the race did not disappoint.

The daughter of Candy Ride (Arg) out of the Broad Brush mare Lightning Lydia certainly turned heads when she blazed 7½ furlongs on a fast track in 1:32.67 in gate-to-wire fashion, winning by 8 lengths even though jockey Jeremy Rose was gearing her down inside the sixteenth pole. Sent off as a slight favorite over Hot Fun in the five-horse field, Walkwithapurpose grabbed the lead from her inside post after an opening quarter in 23.71 seconds and was quickly alone on the lead. Hot Fun gave chase, but settled for a distant second, a length ahead of No Means No.

The victory was the third straight, all at Laurel, for the bay filly after starting her career with a third at Timonium.

“She is very impressive and I expected her to win big, but not that big,” said Correas, a private trainer for Sagamore with 30 of the farm’s horses in his care. “She’s not really a good working horse. She never really gives you a whole lot, but she still gets the job done. I thought she was going to do

it easy, yes, but by 8 lengths? No.”

Walkwithapurpose’s trainer, who has worked with the filly since she was a yearling, termed her a “squirrel” when she first started learning how to be a racehorse. But then the half-sister to Go Maire Tu (third in the 2010 Maryland Juvenile Championship) and 2012 All Brandy Stakes winner Charged Cotton became a quick study.

“She’s very easy to be around and she’s learning,” he said. “Race after race, she gets better. She has become very professional.”

While rebuilding historic Sagamore, once owned by the Vanderbilt family and where Hall of Famers Native Dancer, Discovery and Bed o’ Roses are buried, and restoring the 530-acre farm to prominence, the philosophy of current owner Kevin Plank, the CEO of Under Armour Sportswear, and farm manager Tom Mullikin is to proceed slowly, steadily and patiently. Their stated goal is to produce a new line of champions.

Judging from her performance at Laurel, Walkwithapurpose may have the potential to become one—with the Grade 2 Black-Eyed Susan Stakes at Pimlico in May on her long-term plan for 2013. 🍀



## MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS

### Juvenile Mystic Love takes show on road, defeats the boys

The filly Mystic Love solidified her standing as the best Maryland-bred juvenile of 2012 after her score in the \$100,000 Dania Beach Stakes over a field of nine colts and

geldings at Gulfstream Park Dec. 15.

Making her first start outside of Maryland, the daughter of Not For Love trained by the husband/wife team of Francis and Jessica Campitelli got her third win in four starts for owner John Davison,

and increased her bankroll to \$174,760.

Never defeated on the grass, Mystic Love raced close to the pace while saving ground under Elvis Trujillo in the 1-mile Dania Beach, spurted clear as the field headed into the stretch and held off a late rally by even-money favorite Charming Kitten to win by a half length. Overlooked by the bettors, she paid \$34.

“We believed in her. It was more that we really didn’t want to go a mile and a sixteenth for her first time going two turns,” said Jessie Campitelli, who handles the training duties for the Campitelli stable in Florida. “So we chose to run against the boys.”

“She’s always trained like the longer the better, really,” said Franny Campitelli, who joined his wife in the winner’s circle. “Her getting the distance wasn’t a great surprise. I was more surprised she was able to win at five and a half.”

Mystic Love got her first stakes win in the 5½-furlong \$150,000 Selima Stakes at Laurel Park on Oct. 27.

Bred in Maryland by Dark Hollow Farm, Mystic Love is the second foal out of the winning Dixie Union mare Memories of Mystic. Davison purchased the filly for \$21,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall yearling sale from the Dark Hollow Farm consignment. 🍀

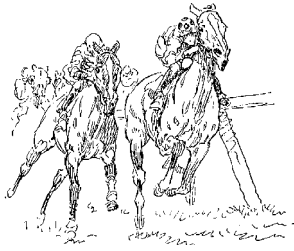
## MHIB Touch of Class Award winners
