Maryland-bred Hall of Fame inducts first class

State racing interests next month will honor Maryland's most accomplished racehorses by unveiling the Maryland-bred Thoroughbred Hall of Fame (MTHOF), an ascendant cooperative that departed different runways.

Scheduled for May 11 at Pimlico Race Course, the Hall of Fame commemorations will reflect a collaboration of the Maryland Racing Media Association (MRMA) and Maryland Horse Breeders Association (MHBA), racing-related entities that unknowingly had shared a vision.

Early this year, MRMA vice president Frank Vespe asked whether breeders would participate in a budding plan to create a Maryland-bred Hall of Fame. The response from MHBA executive director Cricket Goodall: We're already working on one.

"Clearly they were doing something on a parallel track," Vespe said. "So we basically said, 'Why don't we combine forces?'"

The resultant collaboration, which involved racing-industry members beyond those organizations, birthed a committee that in January established guidelines and procedures for

a first-of-its kind state-bred racing Hall of Fame. The committee deemed eligible flat runners and steeplechasers retired from racing at least five years, and selected 12 for its inaugural class: Broad Brush, Challedon, Cigar, Find, Gallorette, Jameela, Politely, Safely Kept, Twixt and Vertex and jumpers Elkridge and Jay Trump.

The committee chose the distinctive dozen on the following bases: Challedon, Cigar, Elkridge, Gallorette, Jay

Trump and Safely Kept are the only Maryland-breds in the National Racing Hall of Fame; Find and Vertex were included in a comprehensive 1963 vote of state sportswriters who determined the greatest-ever racing Maryland-breds; and Broad Brush, Jameela, Politely and Twixt are the only remaining eligible two-time Maryland-bred Horses of the Year, an honor first awarded in 1962.

The committee considered only racehorses for the initial

class but left open the possibility of inducting notable persons in subsequent years. It also determined to limit future classes to no more than two equine inductees.

The May 11 inductions will be ceremonial as part of a Pimlico program that will name certain races for honorees. The MTHOF will exist as an on-line entity (www.mdthoroughbredhalloffame.com) with plans to locate a permanent facility.

"It is virtual now but, as we move forward with a horse-industry museum, we will make sure the great Maryland-bred horses will have a place of honor," Goodall said. "It is important that their achievements be marked for all time."

Goodall and MRMA president Ted Black worked to assemble an MTHOF committee representing an array of state racing interests. Others who attended the January meeting were Cindy Deubler and Anne Pennington of MHBA; Joe Clancy, *Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred* editor and MRMA member; MRMA's Vespe; Josh Pons, breeder and Eclipse Award-winning writer; Katy Voss, trainer/breeder and a director of the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association; Georganne Hale, Maryland Jockey Club racing secretary, and Jim McCue, MJC photographer; and Vinnie Perrone, a frequent *Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred* contributor. The committee likely will grow over time.

"If we could get a good cross-section of people from the industry," Black said, "I thought that would validate the horses we selected."

Black, in his first year as MRMA president, said he conceived the MTHOF as a way both to burnish his legacy and to involve the organization in a meaningful undertaking.

"I figured, let's be part of a project that people are going to remember," Black said. "And when I looked over the list of all the Maryland-bred Horses of the Year, I thought that these were horses that deserved lasting recognition. At the same time, I want to keep it in perspective: We're not saving Maryland racing. We're just honoring the history of it."

In its mission statement, the MTHOF endeavors to celebrate the racing and stud-book achievements of state-bred Thoroughbred horses nationally and internationally, and "to showcase their enduring legacies."

Such was the aim in 1963, when Laurel Race Track president John D. Schapiro enlisted 58 sportswriters to determine the five greatest Maryland-bred runners in history. Here again, the symmetry: Schapiro asked MHBA president Bruce S. Campbell to help determine protocols and facilitate polling.

"Too frequently, we overlook the great horses produced in this state," Schapiro said then. "It is time for us to

evaluate what has been accomplished in Maryland.

"Horses like Challedon, Gallorette and Elkridge re-

ceived plaudits of the racing world when they were in competition, and I feel that those of us in Maryland who are in-

terested in the Thoroughbred should see to it that their fame never dies."

Fifty years later, a shared initiative of that very substance has taken flight.

Broodmare of the Year: Poised to Pounce

The chance to own a piece of “Maryland history” spurred David and JoAnn Hayden and partner William Beatson to bid more than anticipated for Smarten’s daughter Poised to Pounce at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December sale in 2000. The \$142,000 bid, highest of the sale, secured the young broodmare in foal to top Maryland sire Polish Numbers, and gave Dark Hollow Farm in Upperco a link to a stellar family.

“By far the best offering in the sale,” said JoAnn Hayden, and Poised to Pounce proved a bargain at the price. She is now the second Broodmare of the Year to represent Dark Hollow Farm, joining Safely Home, the first award recipient in 1990.

Poised to Pounce is the dam of 2012 Grade 1-winning sprinter Poseidon’s Warrior (by Speightstown), the last of her eight winners from nine foals. The mare was already a stakes producer when she went through the auction, as dam of stakes winner Quick ‘n Smart (by Polish Numbers). She was carrying Play Bingo, who went on to earn \$455,240 and win three stakes, including the Maryland Million Classic. And she also produced stakes-placed Rhythmn Master (by Two Punch).

Bred in the name of Katharine W. Merryman, Poised to Pounce was from a family developed by Merryman and her husband, John, who had purchased Poised to Pounce’s granddam, Counterflight, as a yearling in 1963.

“David always had a great deal of respect for Mr. Merryman and his dealings in breeding, as a farmer, as a cattleman, as a horseman,” said JoAnn. “She was a horse we really wanted to see stay in Maryland.”

A half-sister to the Merrymans’ seven-time stakes winner Smart ‘n Quick, Poised to Pounce is also the granddam of multiple graded stakes-winning sprinter Smart Enough (out of Quick ‘n Smart), an earner of \$873,317.

Owning Poised to Pounce was a joy, notes JoAnn, who was devastated when they lost the 18-year-old mare in 2009 while in foal to Hard Spun. “She was an incredible horse to be around. She was easy, an excellent mother, a wonderful horse to handle.”

Dark Hollow sold six of the seven foals they bred from Poised to Pounce for a combined \$605,000, keeping only Popeye’s Lady (by Forest Wildcat), now a member of the Dark Hollow broodmare band.

Stallion of the Year: Not For Love

Maryland has been home to many influential stallions in the last century, but one stands out for his dominance. Not For Love, Northview Stallion Station’s 23-year-old son of Mr. Prospector, has been selected once again as Stallion of the Year, the 10th time so honored.

In 2012, Not For Love led Maryland’s general and 2-year-old sires lists by progeny earnings, and became the state’s all-time leading juvenile sire by lifetime earnings, a position he also holds on the general sires list. His runners amassed more than \$4.5 million in 2012—the 11th consecutive year above the \$4 million mark.

“The breeders in Maryland have been very supportive of Not For Love and hopefully he has returned the favor,” said Northview president Richard Golden. “When we acquired Not For Love, his world class pedigree was his greatest attraction. There is no formula for purchasing any

stallion but one trait must be outstanding.”

Not For Love was represented by 13 stakes horses last year. His five stakes winners included juveniles Mystic Love and Classy Coco and solid handicap horses Not Abroad, winner of the Maryland Million Classic, and Eighttostocatch. His leading earner, Hello Lover, tied for second in the nation by number of wins (with nine) and was stakes-placed three times while earning \$304,495.

“Now that Not For Love has turned 23, our primary interest is in his well-being,” added Golden. “For the last three years his books have been limited to 50 mares and that is always subject to change, should we notice any adverse indications.

“Keeping Not For Love in Maryland has been a luxury for Northview. Standing a stallion that has won Stallion of the Year 10 times is a wonderful honor for all of us at Northview as well.”

Breeder of the Year: Dr. and Mrs. Thomas Bowman

For the sixth time in the past eight years, Tom and Chris Bowman have been named Maryland Breeders of the Year. The esteemed equine veterinarian and his wife, who own and operate Dance Forth Farm in Chestertown, bred a prolific group of runners, many in partnership, who made 528 starts in 2012 and amassed more than \$2.1 million in earnings.

The most accomplished to represent the Bowmans was Not Abroad, winner of the Maryland Million Classic and Joseph French Memorial Stakes and three times stakes-placed, including a second in the Grade 3 Greenwood Cup.

The son of Not For Love out of Timely Broad, by Broad Brush, was bred in partnership with Milton P. Higgins, Thomas Sutton and Huckleberry Farm LLC. Now 6, Not Abroad earned \$217,190 of his career total \$625,955 last year.

The Bowmans also bred juvenile stakes winners Alpha Mike Foxtrot (in partnership with Richard W. Small) and I Stand Alone (with daughters Quin Bowman and Rebecca Davis), as well as Maryland Hunt Cup winner Twill Do.

This is the seventh Breeder of the Year award for the couple, who were honored in 1998, 2005 to 2008 and 2011.

Concealed Identity back to winning ways in John B. Campbell

Linda Gaudet and Morris Bailey's Concealed Identity found the winner's circle for the first time since November 2011 when digging down in the stretch to win the 59th running of the John B. Campbell Handicap at Laurel Park Feb. 16. It was the fourth stakes win for the horse, but the first for Linda Gaudet as a trainer, as well as the first for apprentice jockey Trevor McCarthy.

The race was not without controversy, as three horses ended up in a drive to the finish line, with Concealed Identity on the outside, Service for Ten on the inside and Norman Asbjornson between them. Service for Ten bore into Norman Asbjornson, forcing him into Concealed Identity. Norman Asbjornson fell back to third as Concealed Identity crossed the finish line first.

After an inquiry and a claim of foul, Concealed Identity was left the winner, Norman Asbjornson was placed second and Service for Ten was disqualified to third.

The winning margin was three-quarters of a length and the final time for the 1 1/8 miles was 1:52.29. The fourth choice in the field of five, Concealed Identity paid \$17.

Concealed Identity, a 5-year-old son of Smarty Jones, improved to 7-for-25 lifetime with earnings of \$332,990. He

won the Maryland Juvenile Championship Stakes at 2, and Federico Tesio Stakes and Find Handicap at 3, while also finishing second in the Grade 3 Pegasus Stakes and third in the Jennings Handicap.

Bred by Bowman and Higgins Stable and Patricia L. Chapman, who owned and bred Smarty Jones with her late husband, Roy Chapman, Concealed Identity was purchased by the Gaudets at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale for \$16,000. He is the second foal out of four-time stakes winner Richetta (by Polish Numbers).

Sagamore Farm fillies prove dominant in Caesar's Wish

Ignacio Correas saddled Walkwithapurpose and Listen Boy for the \$150,000 Caesar's Wish Stakes March 2 at Laurel Park and saw them sweep the top two places in the 1-mile test for 3-year old fillies.

Both are Sagamore Farm homebreds, the winner by Candy Ride (Arg), the runner-up by After Market.

Walkwithapurpose was the prohibitive 2-5 favorite under Jeremy Rose, set the pace and won off by 9 1/2 lengths in 1:38.38. Listen Boy, a 45-1 long-shot, rallied to beat four others to the finish.

Walkwithapurpose has now won five straight races, including three stakes, all at Laurel Park. Prior to the Caesar's Wish she captured the Maryland Juvenile Filly Championship (Dec. 31) and Wide Country Stakes (Feb. 2).

Listen Boy was making her first stakes attempt and completed a \$50 exacta. Correas indicated he would likely use the Twixt Stakes for Maryland-breds on April 6 at Pimlico as Walkwithapurpose's prep race for the \$500,000 Black-Eyed Susan Stakes-G2 on May 17.

Walkwithapurpose, out of the Broad Brush mare Lightning Lydia, paid \$2.80 and improves to 5-for-6 lifetime with earnings of \$272,210.
