MHBA celebrates 90 years

"The formation of an organization, in whole or in part of persons, firms and/or corporations, who have been or are at the present, or who likely will be interested in the breeding and improvement of horses; the fostering and preserving of traditions pertaining to the horse everywhere and particularly the fine traditions of the horse in Maryland. . ."

—From the Articles of Incorporation, Jan. 12, 1929

The Maryland Horse Breeders Association was incorporated 90 years ago this month, becoming the first organization of its kind in the country. While promoting all breeds, the MHBA drew the core of its support from the Thoroughbred industry.

The founders "forged an association intended to encourage the utilization of horses for sport and recreation and to protect the means of production that made Maryland the most enduring steward of our national equine heritage," noted the late Tim

Capps, former executive vice-president of the MHBA.

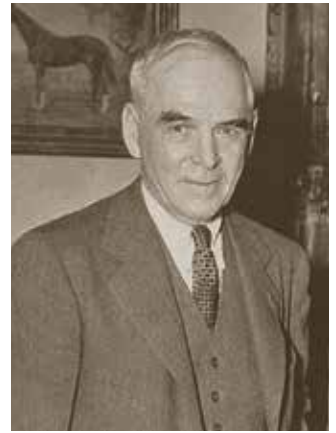
Over the next 12 months the *Maryland Horse* will take a look at the association's history from the past nine decades. This month is a reprint, in part, from the MHBA's 75th anniversary publication by former MHBA president Josh Pons' on the creation and early days of the MHBA.

Visionaries united by love of the horse

Now, as then, it's all about ideas, from a body of men and women serving as board

members of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association—the first, the oldest, such organization in the country.

Then was 1929. The verdant hills and valleys of Maryland grew horsemen like grass. Grandsons of Civil War cavalymen, captains of commerce, transplanted Long Islanders in unspoiled country, courtly politicians, daring steeplechase riders. Beautiful Maryland attracted the allegiance of such men, who shared in common a love of the horse, whether a flat racer at Pimlico, a Hunt Cup war-

Labrot Sr., owner of Holly Beach Farm near Annapolis; Edwin Warfield, the son of a Maryland governor; Howard Bruce, Baltimore banker and owner of famed jumper Billy Barton. The starter's flag dropped, and the MHBA was off and running.

A half-dozen years passed, and in 1936, Labrot's farm manager, Humphrey S. Finney, was elected to the board. Author of *A Stud Farm Diary*, a day-to-day account of life on Labrot's farm serialized by *The Blood-Horse* in 1935 and '36, Finney had an idea he put before the board: Why don't we do a monthly newsletter?

Splendid idea, Finney. Head it up.

Finney pulled some newsworthy items from his desk drawer, his "saddlebag" as he called it, and the periodical *Maryland Horse* was born, weighing in at four pages at birth. Finney's idea would grow in time to be the standard against which all other state breeders' magazines would be measured. Finney became field secretary for the MHBA and editor of the magazine. The "office" was a second floor bedroom in Finney's Towson home.

rior, or a Sunday-safe riding horse. In the agrarian society of the late 1920s, these men all thought it a good idea to pool their talents into a team.

At his desk, Louis McLane Merryman examined the original Articles of Incorporation drafted for the Maryland Horse Breeders Association. He put his chin in his hands, covering his muttonchop sideburns, and was lost in thought.

Yes, to further all things to do with horses—ponies, race horses, draft horses—a broad

purpose for our association. I'll sign that.

Dr. J. Fred Adams thought about his stable of race horses, of crisp spring mornings at state tracks such as Havre de Grace, the sun banking off the Chesapeake Bay as horses worked in the breaking day.

It's time to band together to serve as stewards for this exciting pastime. Think what we'll accomplish if we work together. Where do I sign?

Janon Fisher Jr. had horses to ride.

Helluva good idea. He signed.

The Maryland Horse Breeders Association became a legal entity on the signatures of these three men. Their first order of business? Elect a president. Breckinridge Long stood tall among the horsemen. Assistant Secretary of State during World War I. Gracious owner of the Monticello estate between the towns of Bowie and Laurel. Urbane. A born leader. First president of the MHBA.

He surrounded himself with talented board members.

H.G. "Hard Guy" Bedwell, trainer of Sir Barton, the first Triple Crown winner (1919);

Maryland Horse Industry Day in Annapolis: Jan. 29

The Maryland horse industry will be in Annapolis Jan. 29 to meet with elected officials and showcase the state's equine community. The event is modeled after other major industries and organizations in Maryland which annually host dinners, breakfasts and receptions during the 90-day General Assembly, tied in with meetings with legislative delegations.

All equine-interested individuals are invited to attend, and advocacy experience is

not required. Attendees will convene in the morning to prep for legislative meetings, then meet in small groups with legislators. When legislators are in session, presentations, discussions and a Q&A with legislative staffers will be held, followed by a boxed lunch.

The tentative schedule is:

7:30 to 8 a.m.: Registration, coffee and snacks.

8 to 10 a.m.: Meetings with legislators (pre-scheduled, and drop-ins).

10 to 11:30 a.m.: Advocacy 101; panel discussions and award presentations.

11:30 to 1 p.m.: Lunch with legislators and salutations.

The Maryland Horse Council website has set up an invite to RSVP. Those who register will be invited to a preview call the week prior to Maryland Horse Industry Day to discuss talking points and prep for the event. Those who only are able to attend for part of the day are asked to register as legislator meetings will be

booked based on attendees' availability.

Maryland Horse Industry Day 2019 is presented by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association and Maryland Million Ltd. as well as the Maryland Horse Council, Cloverleaf Standardbred Owners Association, Fasig-Tipton Co., Maryland Association for Wildlife Conservation, Maryland Horse Industry Board, Maryland Jockey Club, Maryland Standardbred Breeders Association, Maryland State Fair, Maryland Steeplechase Association, Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, Ocean Downs Racetrack and Rosecroft Raceway. 🐾

Maryland-breds sell well at Keeneland November Sale

Three racing or broodmare prospects bred and campaigned by Sagamore Farm were among the four highest priced Maryland-breds sold at the Keeneland November Sale, Nov. 5 to Nov. 16 in Lexington, Ky.

The most expensive, at \$350,000, was stakes winner Ginger N Rye, purchased by Boomer Bloodstock, agent. The now 6-year-old daughter of More Than Ready last started in September 2017 when off the board in the Presque Isle Downs Masters Stakes-G2. In her prior effort she won Saratoga's Smart N Fancy Stakes. She'd earlier finished second in the All Brandy and Dahlia stakes, and from 17 starts earned \$296,973.

Ginger N Rye is one of two winners for the Mr. Greeley mare La Milanese, a half-sister to millionaire and champion sire Bowman's Band and to the dam of millionaire and sire Pollard's Vision.

Consigned by Upson Downs Farm, Ginger N Rye

was not mated, and sold as a racing or broodmare prospect.

Selling for \$300,000 to Richard Golden (David Wade, agent) was Sagamore's stakes-placed Southampton Way. A daughter of Into Mischief, Southampton Way was sold as a broodmare prospect, her last start an unplaced effort last June in her only start at 3. A half-sister to stakes winner Tell a Great Story and stakes-placed Give No Quarter and All I Karabout, Southampton Way won a Saratoga maiden race as a 2-year-old, and during the same meet finished in the Grade 2 Adirondack Stakes before shipping to Arlington and finishing second in the Arlington-Washington Lassie. Out of the Not For Love mare Roadtohana, Southampton Way is from the family of stakes winners Steak Scam and Polish Rifle.

Chubby Star, winner of an allowance at Laurel Park in August in her last start for Sagamore, sold for \$180,000, with WinStar Farm making

the purchase. The 2014 Malibu Moon filly, out of stakes-placed Salsa Star (by Giant's Causeway), is a half-sister to one of the top Maryland-bred runners of 2018, multiple stakes-winning filly Blamed.

Sold as a racing or broodmare prospect, Chubby Star won three of 14 starts, earning \$142,446, and finished second in the James W. Murphy Stakes at Pimlico in 2017. Twice she was fourth in graded company. Out of a half-sister to multiple graded winner Pacific Ocean, Chubby Star is from the family of champion Rhythm, Grade 1 winner Frost Giant and leading Mid-Atlantic sire Not For Love.

Tops among weanlings offered was Knicks Go's half-brother by Broken Vow. The gray/roan colt, consigned by Bill Reightler, agent, on behalf of breeders Angie and Sabrina Moore's Greenmount Farm, was purchased by Rock Brothers Breeding for \$115,000. He is the sixth foal

out of multiple stakes winner Kosmo's Buddy, whose son Knicks Go raised the family's profile after winning the Claiborne Breeders' Futurity-G1 at Keeneland and finishing second in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile-G1 at Churchill Downs the Friday prior to the sale.

Also bringing six figures, with Eaton Bloodstock making the final bid at \$200,000, was maiden mare Holiday Blues, a daughter of Ghostzapper out of multiple stakes winner Deputy Cures Blues. A half-sister to four-time stakes winner and Grade 1-placed Wine Police, a son of Speightstown who earned \$509,873, Holiday Blues was sold at age 5 in foal to Speightstown. A multiple winner for her breeder, Marathon Farms, she was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency for MLB Equine Investments.

Thirty-seven Maryland-breds were sold, for an average of \$45,451. 🐾

Richard Golden's Victory Rally, facing stakes competition for the first time late in her 4-year-old season, added

her name to the growing list of stakes winners in her family when she rode the rail under Jorge Vargas Jr. and splashed home a gutsy neck winner over Another Broad in the \$75,000 Geisha Stakes at Laurel Park Nov. 24.

It was the second consecutive win for Michael Matz-trained Victory Rally, and fourth in 11 tries at Laurel. The winning time was 1:38.08 for 1 mile over a sloppy main track.

Sent off as the 5-1 sixth choice in the field of eight, Victory Rally had a similar trip to her previous effort Nov. 3 where she saved ground early before opening up for a 6¼-length allowance romp. In the Geisha, the daughter of Jump Start tracked in fourth as 39-1 long shot Wowwhatabrat sailed through fractions of :23.95 and :47.02, having plenty of room to scoot up the rail as the pacesetter retreated straightening for home and hold off Another Broad through the stretch.

"She was pretty comfortable by the backstretch so I didn't panic or anything," Vargas said. "I just sat in the pocket like I did last time, and she just was full of run. When I asked her she was there for me, and that was it."

Bred by her owner and foaled at his Sycamore Hall Farm in Chesapeake City, Victory Rally is out of Amer-

ican Victory, a stakes-winning daughter of Victory Gallop and half-sister to Maryland-bred champion 3-year-old and turf horse Giant Run. American Victory has produced four foals of racing age—her other winner is Charmed Victory, a stakes-placed runner and the highest-priced yearling when sold for \$260,000 at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall sale. The mare's Flatter filly, Affezionamente, sold for \$150,000 two years later at the same sale. American Victory has a 2-year-old colt by Flatter, an RNA at \$120,000 at last fall's sale, and produced a filly by Declaration of War last April. She was bred back to Honor Code for this year.

Victory Rally's second dam, multiple graded stakes-winning turf mare Who Did It and Run (by Polish Numbers), is the dam of additional stakes performer Who's Cozy, the dam of stakes winner Who's in Town and stakes-placed Campaign Vows, and granddam of stakes-placed Buff's in Love. Who's Cozy's yearling son by Uncle Mo sold for \$200,000 to top all colts at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall sale.

Scrap Copper showcases talent in James F. Lewis III

Kathleen Willier's Scrap Copper, overlooked in the wagering at 9-1, came with a steady drive down the stretch

to catch front-running Follow the Dog and edge past for a three-quarter-length win in the \$100,000 James F. Lewis III



Stakes for 2-year-olds at Laurel Park Nov. 10.

Beaten as the favorite in the Maryland Million Nursery Oct. 20 following a stumble

out of the gate, Scrap Copper completed the distance in 1:10.87 while turning back Nursery winner Follow the Dog. Fayette Warrior was

third while 7-5 favorite Passcode finished sixth.

"Turning for home, I was like if he's got his stride like he shows in the morning, he's going to mow them down," said rider Trevor McCarthy. "I'm a little bummed because I loved him Maryland Million Day and I was looking to really get a win that day. The way he broke today, I knew he was going to be tough to beat."

Trained by Hamilton Smith, Scrap Copper won his first stakes in his fourth start. He scored in his debut July 22 at Laurel and rallied to be beaten a nose in the Laurel Futurity over a yielding grass course Sept. 22.

"The last time he stumbled real bad leaving there and we lost all chance. It's a shame, but he made up for it today," Smith said. "He's a very versatile colt. We're looking forward to running him longer next year."

Scrap Copper is from the final crop bred by the late Nellie M. Cox and her Rose Retreat Farm, and was born at Anchor

and Hope Farm in Port Deposit less than a month after Cox's death in February 2016. The son of 2018 Maryland leading sire Great Notion is the third winner from as many starters for his dam After All, a daughter of Olmodavor and Maryland-bred stakes winner Citi Sounds (by Citidancer).

Willier purchased Scrap Copper out of the Cox estate consignment at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic winter mixed sale in January 2017 for \$15,000. After All was also sold by the estate at the same sale, in foal to Bourbon Courage, for \$5,500 to Walter N. Vieser II. The mare delivered a chestnut Bourbon Courage filly that March, and went back to Great Notion the past two years. Her most recent foal is a colt born last March.

After All's first two foals, fillies Had It All (by Songandaprayer) and Gimmeacue (Gimmeawink), have earned \$185,090 and \$146,223, respectively. Scrap Copper now has earnings of \$111,640.

Blamed records first graded win in Aqueduct's Comely-G3

Cleber Massey's Blamed recorded her fourth stakes win of 2018, and first in graded company, when leading every step of the 69th running of the Grade 3, \$200,000 Comely for 3-year-old fillies at Aqueduct Nov. 23.

The daughter of Blame emphatically answered the question of handling the increased distance when she raced to the front of the 1½-mile stakes, extended her lead coming out of the final turn and outkicked a charging Remedy in deep stretch to win by three-quarters of a length.

"She's fast, naturally fast," said rider Julien Leparoux. "She broke fast. We could have slowed down a little bit, but she was very comfortable and she did it very nicely. She was doing easy the whole way, and when I asked her, she really kicked in very nice

for me. I think we had a little bit more left in the tank at the wire, so that's nice."

Blamed, the 6-5 favorite, had won previously going two turns at Sunland Park in the 1¼-mile Sunland Park Oaks March 25, the last of five consecutive wins she earned for Joel Marr before Hall of Famer Bill Mott took over the training duties before a runner-up effort in the 7-furlong Grade 2 Raven Run Oct. 20 at Keeneland.

Stretching out to the Comely distance for the first time, the filly improved to 6-2-0 in eight starts and improved her earnings to \$401,260.

"We looked around the country for 3-year-old races that were left for her and this was one of the only options we had," said Mott. "Of course, I think it will tell us something about her going into next year.

It will give us an indication of what her possibilities might be."

Bred by Sagamore Farm, Blamed is the fourth named foal out of Salsa Star, a daughter of Giant's Causeway raced by Sagamore to a win at Pimlico. After making her final start in January 2010, Salsa Star was retired as a broodmare and the next year produced a colt by Tiznow named Nest of Pirates, a winner at Laurel for his breeder in 2014. The mare's second foal, the gelding Thought Leader (by Street Sense), never made it to the races. The next two foals, both fillies, are stakes horses.

Sagamore Farm raced Blamed's year-old half-sister Chubby Star through last August before selling her for \$180,000 at the Keeneland No-

vember breeding stock sale. The daughter of Malibu Moon won three of 14 starts, with two seconds and a third, including a second in the James W. Murphy Stakes at Pimlico in May 2017, while earning \$142,446.

The final foal bred by Sagamore out of Salsa Star is Chase Greatness, a 3-year-old gelded son of More Than Ready who broke his maiden at Churchill Downs last June under the Sagamore colors.

Salsa Star was sold for \$100,000 at the 2016 Keeneland November breeding stock sale in foal to Super Saver. Blamed was a \$77,000 RNA when offered at that year's Keeneland September Yearling sale and was purchased privately by her current owner after the sale.
