\$1,000,000 **Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1**

**K**nicks Go burst onto the national stage last year at 4 and became one of the biggest stories of the year. Making only three starts, he earned more than any other state-bred after scoring in the \$1 million Breeder's Cup Dirt Mile-G1. And he is now a two-time Maryland-bred Horse of the Year.

Owned by Korea Racing Authority, who purchased him as a yearling at the 2017 Keeneland September sale for \$87,000, Knicks Go came into 2020 as a horse who had lost

his way. At 2, he earned accolades by way of Kentucky when winning the Grade 1 Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland, and using that momentum to take on Game Winner in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile-G1. Knicks Go led until deep stretch and finished second.

A 3-year-old march on the classics looked a foregone conclusion, but it would be more than nine months (and six starts) before he would hit the board again in stakes com-

pany, and the rest of 2019 was also a disappointment.

When Knicks Go reappeared at 4 under the care of new trainer Brad Cox, he dominated an Oaklawn Park allowance by 7½ lengths in February. During Covid shutdowns, he was also shut down, sidelined by a bone chip that was removed. Off for nearly four months, he returned to Keeneland in October and proved a monster, setting a track record of 1:40.79 for 1¼ miles and winning the allowance by double digits.

Although he had just two allowance wins over the past two years, Knicks Go was sent off as favorite of 12 in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1 last November at Keeneland. And the result was never in doubt. He set every fraction, repelled all challengers and was geared down as he reached the wire ¾ lengths in front while setting another track record of 1:33.85. He joined the select list of Maryland-bred Breeders' Cup winners—Safely Kept (Sprint, 1990), Concern (Classic, 1994), Cigar (Classic, 1995) and Sharing (Juvenile Fillies Turf, 2019).

The win was worth \$520,000, which propelled him beyond the \$1 million mark in career earnings. For the year he took home \$608,440.

Bred by Angie Moore and her daughter Sabrina Moore and foaled at their GreenMount Farm in the Worthington Valley, Knicks Go is a four-time Renaissance Award winner, adding the 2020 trophies to his 2-year-old male and Horse of the Year crowns of 2018.

## \$100,000 Maryland Juvenile Futurity

Veterinarians Dr. A. Leonard Pineau and his wife Patricia Bradley have been turning out beautifully bred horses at their Three Pines Farm in the Worthington Valley for decades. Selling commercially, they've watched a number go on to sell for six or seven figures. A recent example is undefeated Jaxon Traveler, a Munnings colt out of Listen Boy sold by Three Pines for \$80,000 as a yearling at the

Keeneland September sale in 2019 and pinhooked at Ocala the following spring. West Point Thoroughbreds went to \$140,000 for the juvenile colt, and in three starts saw the dark bay nearly earn back his purchase price.

Trained by Steve Asmussen and racing for West Point and Marvyn Delfiner, Jaxon Traveler made three trips from his New York base to Maryland at 2, and left an impres-

sion. He romped by 10 lengths in his debut at Pimlico in September. In his second start, going 6 furlongs at Laurel in October, he won by daylight in 1:09 and change.

Stakes company was next, and he led at every call, holding off Singlino to win the 7-furlong Maryland Juvenile Futurity by nearly a length. Jaxon Traveler's earnings rose to \$120,762. He was then shipped south with the As-

mussen string to Oaklawn to train over the winter.

Jaxon Traveler is the first Maryland-bred champion for his breeders, who purchased his dam while carrying her second foal (by Street Boss) in November 2015 for \$26,000. The mare has four winners from as many foals of racing age. She produced a Street Boss filly in May 2019, has no foal for 2020 and was bred to Cross Traffic for 2021. 🐾

When Street Lute stepped onto the racing scene, she didn't just win, she made her wins count. All five, four in stakes, to be exact. So it was no surprise when Lucky 7 Stables' daughter of Street

Magician took home Maryland-bred honors as champion 2-year-old filly.

Breaking her maiden on debut in early September by a length at Delaware Park, the Jerry Robb trainee kicked it

up a notch in her second start to win the Small Wonder, her stakes debut, by 5 lengths. Returning to her home base of Laurel Park in October for the Maryland Million Lassie, Street Lute suffered her only defeat as she finished second as the favorite to Miss Nondescript, by a neck.

Quick to resurrect her win streak, Street Lute hit a stakes triple in the Smart Halo, Maryland Juvenile Filly Championship and Gin Talking.

Purchased for \$10,500 as a yearling by Robb at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton fall yearling sale, the 2-year-old chestnut earned \$290,220.

Bred by Dr. and Mrs. Thomas Bowman and Dr. Brooke Bowman, Street Lute is the second foal, and only starter, for the Midnight Lute mare Alottalute, who has since produced the just-turned 2-year-old Alottahope (by Editorial) and a yearling full-sister to the newly minted Maryland-bred champion. 🐾

With the collection of accolades Sharing gathered in 2019 as Maryland-bred Horse of the Year, turf runner and 2-year-old filly, it's no surprise she'd tackle 2020 with the same fiery talent.

Owned by Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and

Gainesway Stable (Antony Beck), Sharing won two of five starts at 3, including the Edgewood-G2 and Tepin Stakes at Churchill Downs, and finished second in Royal Ascot's Coronation Stakes-G1 and third in the American Oaks-G1 at Santa Anita,

which would be her final start. She was voted champion turf runner and champion 3-year-old filly of 2020.

The daughter of Speights-town kicked off the year with a victory in the Tepin in May before making a trip overseas to tackle the Coronation less than a month later. Over a course rated good to soft, she fought hard to finish second.

Back in the states, Sharing returned in September to

record her fourth stakes win in the Edgewood before her West Coast campaign.

Following in the footsteps of her dam, Breeders' Cup winner Shared Account also trained by Graham Motion, Sharing became a millionaire with earnings to \$1,092,751 in nine starts. It was announced in January that the Sagamore Farm-bred was retired from racing after suffering an injury in a paddock mishap.

Field Pass' sophomore campaign was busy, far-flung and productive as he led all Maryland-breds by stakes wins (five), earned \$450,143, and was a three-time graded winner.

Racing primarily on turf for Three Diamonds Farm,

the gray son of Lemon Drop Kid trained by Mike Maker launched his year in February, getting his first stakes win in Gulfstream Park's Dania Beach. Next out over Turfway Park's synthetic track in mid-March he won his first graded

race, the track's signature classic prep now named the Jeff Ruby Steaks-G3. He stayed in Kentucky for his next three starts which included back-to-back stakes wins in the Audubon at Churchill Downs and the Grade 3 Transylvania at Keeneland.

A trip to Saratoga resulted in his worst finish (seventh) and Grade 2 placings at Churchill and Santa Anita followed. In his second start over a synthetic surface, at Woodbine for the Ontario Der-

by-G3, he drove home a clear winner. In 10 starts last year, he won five and was third in three others.

Field Pass was bred by New Jersey resident Mark Grier, who foaled his mares in Maryland after breeding in Kentucky for a number of years. Grier raced Field Pass' dam Only Me (by Runaway Groom) and kept her as a broodmare. The dam of two named foals (both winners), she has since been retired from breeding.

**N**ever Enough Time proved things do get better with time as she secured back-to-back stakes wins in the Alma North and Skipat last fall and placed in two more stakes to earn the title of 2020 Maryland-bred champion older female for owner/breeder R. Larry Johnson.

Unraced at 2, the daughter of Munnings won twice at 3

in four starts and tried graded stakes company. It would be more than a year until she took on stakes company again, scoring in Laurel Park's Alma North in her second attempt last September.

During a string of six races at 4, four in stakes, she never finished worse than third and won on a big stage, the Preakness Day undercard at Pimlico

in October, when outrunning top sprint mare Bronx Beauty in the Skipat. Never Enough Time also counted a second in the Primonetta Stakes at Laurel and a third in Belmont Park's Pumpkin Pie Stakes.

In eight starts in 2020, the Mike Trombetta trainee won three, with two seconds and a third, and earned \$201,131.

Never Enough Time is one of five winners from six starters for Johnson's multiple stakes-placed homebred What Time It Is, a daughter of Maryland-bred champion Partner's Hero. The mare was bred back to Munnings for this year. 🐾

**L**aki is now a two-time Renaissance Award winner after a campaign that proved him not only durable but still fast. The Hillside Equestrian Meadows' colorbearer at age 7 recorded his first graded stakes victory when taking the Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash-G3 at Pimlico on the Preakness Day undercard,

and was first or second in six of seven starts on the year.

Not making his 2020 debut until July, the Damon Dilodovico trainee annexed the Oceanport Centennial Stakes at Monmouth Park at 5 furlongs. Racing at least once a month through the end of the year, he was always in the thick of it, but the De Francis

Dash was by far his career highlight. Squeezed, checked, sent wide and having to make up ground, he got up to win in the final strides by a slimmest of noses.

Last year was his richest in five years of competition, as he earned \$241,030 of his career total \$709,662.

A previous two-time MATCH Series champion in the 3-Year-Olds and Up Dirt

Sprint division, Laki was bred by Tom Michaels and Lorna Baker, and is a son of the late Not For Love stallion Cuba, who stood in Maryland. In 30 starts through 2020, Laki never ran beyond 7 furlongs, but his previous Renaissance Award was for champion older male in 2018; that year's 3-year-old champion Still Having Fun earned sprint honors. 🐾



## 2020 MHBA Stallion of the Year: GREAT NOTION

For the fifth consecutive year Great Notion is recognized as Maryland's Stallion of the Year.

The leader in the state in nearly every category in 2020—earnings by all runners, earnings by 2-year-olds, number of overall winners and by number of wins—he also led by number of stakes winners, with six. Four came on the same day as he joined a select group of stallions to sire as many on a single Maryland Million Day card.

Great Notion had stakes winners last year from his

crop of 2-year-olds (Kenny Had a Notion), 3-year-olds (Karan's Notion), 4-year-olds (Pretty Good Year and Epic Idea), 5-year-olds (What the Beep) and 6-year-olds (Anna's Bandit). His West Virginia-bred daughter Anna's Bandit, who has won or placed in 20 stakes in 36 career starts, became his richest runner last year when pushing her earnings to \$782,655.

Now 21 years old, Great Notion, a son of Elusive Quality, has stood his entire career at Northview Stallion Station in Chesapeake City. 🐾

## 2020 MHBA Breeder of the Year: ANGIE MOORE

Quality over quantity. Angie Moore took that to the extreme in 2020 as Grade 1 winner and eventual Maryland-bred Horse of the Year Knicks Go delivered a Breeder of the Year award.

The now 5-year-old won all three of his 2020 starts, topped by the Grade 1 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in November. The son of Paynter earned \$608,440 while becoming just the fifth Maryland-bred to win a Breeders' Cup race.

Foaled at GreenMount Farm in Glyndon, the boarding/sales farm Moore owns with her daughter Sabrina, Knicks Go comes from a long line of Maryland-breds. His dam Kosmo's Buddy (by Outflanker) was a two-time stakes winner before being claimed by Moore for \$40,000 in September 2010. The mare was sold privately in late 2018.

Moore-bred horses made 44 starts in 2020 with 10 wins and \$754,165 in earnings. 🐾

## 2020 MHBA Broodmare of the Year: LOVE'S REASON

A 13-year-old daughter of Not For Love, Love's Reason has produced a succession of stakes performers for Richard Golden's Sycamore Hall Thoroughbreds LLC and Ellen Charles' Hillwood Stables since her first foal arrived in 2013.

The best runner to date is her now 6-year-old daughter Majestic Reason, Maryland-bred champion older mare of 2019 who made only one start in 2020, but it was glorious, a dominant victory

in Laurel Park's Grade 3 Barbara Fritchie Stakes—her first graded win and third stakes win overall before she was retired as a broodmare herself.

Love's Reason's earlier two foals are stakes-placed runners Jump for Love and Good Reasoning. All five of her foals of racing age have started, four are winners, including the 2020 3-year-old gelding Artistic Reason. Love's Reason herself was a stakes winner, when taking the 2010 Maryland Juvenile Filly Championship. 🐾

## Other Renaissance Awards

A collaboration of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association, Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Maryland Jockey Club, the Renaissance Awards honor the best of Thoroughbred racing in the state. Other award winners for 2020 include:

### Owner—Robert Bone

Horses owned by Robert Bone won 30 races at Maryland tracks in 2020, and they finished second 15 times and third 14 times. That success fueled his Maryland earnings of \$981,000. Bone captured the Laurel Park summer meet

owner's title with 14 victories from 42 starters.

Bone, based in California, expanded his operation to the Mid-Atlantic several years ago because of lower costs, purse structure and opportunities given the number of racetracks. In Maryland, his trainer is Claudio Gonzalez.

Known primarily for claiming horses, Bone had two stakes winners in Maryland in 2020, both trained by Gonzalez. Maryland-bred Eastern Bay, claimed for \$35,000 in February, won the Polynesian Stakes at Laurel in September, and two days later Completed Pass won the Laurel Dash.

## Trainer— Claudio Gonzalez

Claudio Gonzalez captured the training title at every meet in Maryland in 2020 and racked up 101 wins—more than half his overall total of 171 for the year. In addition, he won 10 stakes with six horses in Maryland, his highest one-year total.

Gonzalez, who stables at Laurel Park, trained Harpers First Ride, a Maryland-bred Horse of the Year finalist who won four stakes including the Grade 3 Pimlico Special. Claimed by Gonzalez for \$30,000 in Kentucky in September 2019, Harpers First Ride won seven races in 2020 and earned almost \$500,000.

Lebda, a 3-year-old last year, captured the Miracle Wood and Private Terms at Laurel. Other Maryland stakes winners were Completed Pass, Eastern Bay, Miss Leslie and Princess Cadey.

Gonzalez has won three Renaissance Awards as Trainer of the Year after being recognized in 2017 and 2018.

## Jockey— Trevor McCarthy

Trevor McCarthy set the tone for a successful 2020 when he captured the riding title at the Covid-shortened Laurel Park winter meet with 38 victories. He also led the short Preakness meet at Pimlico with nine wins, won 27 times during the Laurel summer meet—he left early to ride at Colonial Downs—and found the winner's circle 25 times during the Laurel fall meet.

McCarthy, who left Maryland in late fall to ride in New York, won his first Renaissance Award in 2019, when he won 170 races in Maryland under a full racing schedule. In 2020 his total was 99 in-state and 143 overall. His mounts earned more than \$5.4 million,

\$3.7 million in Maryland. He won 11 stakes in Maryland with 11 horses, and registered two three-baggers—Virginia-bred stakes day Oct. 9 and Maryland Million day Oct. 24.

## MTHA Unsung Hero Award—Victor Carrasco

A top jockey in Maryland, Victor Carrasco was recognized for his behind-the-scenes work with backstretch workers at Laurel and Pimlico. The 28-year-old was a hot walker and groom in his native Puerto Rico before becoming a jockey, and hasn't forgotten.

"I grew up on the backstretch back home," he said. I know how it feels and I know hard it can get. Here in Maryland, especially with this weather, they work through the cold. Sometimes they don't get the credit they deserve. People don't realize that grooms, exercise riders and

hot walkers are the ones living with the horses every day. The real MVP of every winner's circle photo is the groom."

## Pimlico Backstretch Employee of the Year— Edgar Gallegos

Edgar Gallegos, 27, is a native of Mexico who has worked in the racing industry for about eight years at Maryland tracks. He worked for Horacio de Paz and Mary Epler before joining the Brittany Russell team.

## Laurel Backstretch Employee of the Year— Antonio Lopez Salazar

Part of the team at trainer Phil Schoenthal's barn since 2014, Antonio Lopez Salazar has worked with stakes winners Sonny Inspired and Elevated Vision in a career of about 20 years in racing. He previously worked for trainer Leo Nechamkin. 🐾



## MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNER

### Hello Hot Rod drives home in Jimmy Winkfield Stakes

**M**aking his stakes debut for owners Brittany Russell and Dark Horse Racing in Aqueduct's \$100,000 Jimmy Winkfield Stakes for 3-year-olds Jan. 31, Hello Hot Rod led throughout and dug in to win by a head over Maryland-bred Return the Ring.

Making his fourth start, and first away from his home

base of Laurel Park, the dark bay from the first crop of Country Life Farm stallion Mosler broke from the inside and moved to the front under encouragement from Trevor McCarthy. While Return the Ring chased in second from the outside, with favorite Pico d'Oro third, the Russell trainee led through an open-

ing quarter-mile in :23.86 and half in :48.16. As they rounded the far turn, Return the Ring breathed down the leader's neck and Pico d'Oro rallied, but all efforts were in vain as Hello Hot Rod hit the wire first in 1:26.30 for 7 furlongs.

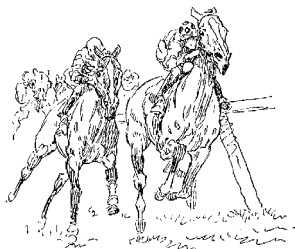
Less than a week later, Russell entered the colt in the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky winter mixed sale, and he topped all racing prospects when sold to George Sharp for \$335,000.

"This is a business and it just seemed like sort of a good business move after winning the stake up there," Russell said before the sale. "I have some friends between Fasig and [consignor] ELiTE sales and I thought it was a good move."

The colt was purchased as a yearling by Dark Horse Racing and Russell for \$10,000 at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall sale, and earned \$113,941 from four starts, with three wins and a second, before being sold.

Hello Hot Rod made his debut last October in a 6-furlong waiver maiden, where he finished second by a neck. Just a couple weeks later, he broke his maiden going 7 furlongs, winning by 4¼ lengths. The success continued as he stepped up to allowance company in December and, stretched out to a mile, defeated eventual stakes winner Shackqueenking in 1:38.38.
