Selima Room collection has a long history

The Selima Room was unique. It offered horse enthusiasts a little slice of heaven at the Bowie branch of the Prince George's County Memorial Library for nearly 50 years. Thought to be the only collection of its kind in a public library in the country, it was available to anyone with an interest in horses. And its ties to history ran deep, as the library occupied land that was once part of the famed Belair Stud farm, the home of one of the great Thoroughbreds of the 18th century and collection's namesake, Selima.

When plans to renovate the Bowie library after 45 years were being discussed in 2014,

the Selima Room was on the chopping block. MHBA staff learned of the collection's need for a new home and arrangements were made. By the time construction began in Bowie in January 2017, the entire collection had been boxed up and moved to storage, awaiting a chance to be back on display in the MHBA library.

Known for its diversity, the collection more than doubled in size during its Bowie years, from February 1969 through November 2016.

Contrary to popular belief, the Selima Room did not start with a collection from William Woodward (Sr. or Jr., the last owners of Belair Stud), but

from a large donation from Laurel Race Course in 1968, which included nearly 2,000 volumes of books and manuscripts amassed by track operators since its opening in 1911.

Frank J. Brady, general manager and vice president of Laurel, made a formal presentation of the gift to Elizabeth B. Hage, the county library director, in the track's winner's circle following the 1968 Selima (for history buffs, Shuvee was the winner).

From hard-core handicappers (Andy Beyer was once said to have called it "a horse-player's paradise"—for many years the *Daily Racing Form* was a library staple), to train-

ers, to breeding enthusiasts and 4-Hers, the Selima Room saw plenty of foot traffic. And the collection was not limited to racing. "We also get a lot of young kids who just come in to thumb through the magazines and books and look at horse pictures," said librarian Susan Stephenson in 1974. Hired in July 1970, Stephenson oversaw the collection for more than 45 years.

The Selima Room shelves held many treasures, among them complete sets of *American Race Horses* (1936-63) and The Jockey Club's *Racing In America* series, as well as the English published *Racing At Home and Abroad*, chronicling the beginnings of the sport.

The hundreds of books, many out-of-print or hard to find, cover an array of topics—horses, races, all manner of

careers with horses, all disciplines. And one slender volume seemed destined for the shelf: *Belair Stud, 1741-61*, published in 1929, which provides history of the land where the collection was born. And the Selima Room's new home, in Thoroughbred-rich Baltimore County, has a history all its own.

Kiss the Girl has always been star material. The daughter of Into Mischief topped the

2018 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall yearling sale on a \$210,000 bid by Three Diamonds Farm. She broke her maiden at Belmont Park first time out in June 2019, and immediately stepped up to stakes competition, missing by a neck when second in the Grade 3 *Schuylerville* at Saratoga.

But it took a dozen tries for her to break through as a stakes winner, which she accomplished when digging in down the stretch in the \$75,000 *Conniver Stakes* at Laurel Park March 13.

Following a second in the *Geisha Stakes* in January, her first start of the year, Kiss the

Girl went off as the 2-1 favorite in the *Conniver* and settled on the outside in fourth as 2020 *Geisha* winner *Artful Splatter* led through the first quarter-mile in :23.31.

Artful Splatter increased her lead around the turn through a half-mile in :46.31, but couldn't keep up with the hard-charging *Kiss the Girl*, who took over late and held off *Lookin Dynamic* to win by three-quarters of a length. Final time for the 7 furlongs was 1:23.21.

Trainer Mike Trombetta said the victory "means a lot to all of us. It's always fun to win a stake, but you take a filly that has this type of pedigree and it becomes very important."

Initially trained by Todd Pletcher and later Steve Asmussen, *Kiss the Girl* moved to the Maryland-based Trombetta after an off-the-board finish in Delaware Park's *Christiana Stakes* last July. In five starts since she's recorded two wins, a second, a third and a fourth.

Her overall record improved to 4-2-2 from 12 starts for \$221,056 in earnings.

Bred by Classic Thoroughbred XII, *Kiss the Girl* is the first foal and only starter from her dam *Spin the Bottle*, a Maryland-bred daughter of *Hard Spun* and half-sister to graded stakes-placed sprinter *Nathan's H Q*. The mare has a yearling filly by *Malibu Moon* and a daughter of *Classic Empire* this year. She is being bred to 2020 champion older dirt male *Improbable*.

A model of consistency, *Whereshetoldmetogo* kicked off his 6-year-old campaign with a dominating 2½-length victory in the \$75,000 *Not For Love Stakes* at Laurel Park March 13.

Back in the gate after a nearly three-month layoff, *Whereshetoldmetogo* was sent off the 1-5 favorite against six others. It was a hotly contested dash at the start as 5 lengths covered the field through an opening quarter of :22.48, with the favorite about 3 lengths off pacesetters *Stroll Smokin* and *Carey Times*. As they flew into the turn after the half in :45.20, *Whereshetoldmetogo* moved around

longshot Day the Music Died, went four wide, grabbed the lead at the top of the stretch and charged to the wire. Once again the flashy chestnut made it interesting as he lugged in late, but didn't impede any of those behind, the closest being Karan's Notion, who rallied after having to check earlier in the race. Day the Music Died finished third. The final time was 1:09.82.

"The horse looked like he was comfortable the whole way," trainer Brittany Russell said. "Sheldon [Russell] had him in a good spot and they took care of it."

It was the gelding's third consecutive stakes win going 6 furlongs at Laurel, following a nose victory over Laki in the Frank Y. Whiteley back in November and a win over Taco Supream in the Dave's Friend in December. Though first to cross the wire in the 6-furlong New Castle Stakes at Delaware in September, Whereshetoldmetogo was disqualified to second.

Campaigned by Black Cloud Racing (Mark Esposito), who purchased him for \$7,000 as a yearling at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall sale, and trained by Anthony Pecoraro, the son of El Padrino was a stakes winner at 2 and multiple stakes winner at 3 before Esposito sold a major interest to a group led by

Madaket Stables, along with Ten Strike Racing and Michael E. Kisber. In his first start for his new owners, he finished second to Firenze Fire in the Gallant Bob Stakes-G3 at Parx, where he tried to savage the winner near the wire.

Transferred to trainer Brad Cox in 2019, he made four starts, with his best runs an

allowance victory at Churchill Downs and a third in the Thanksgiving Classic at Fair Grounds. After an eight-month hiatus, Whereshetoldmetogo returned last July to finish third in the Iowa Sprint Stakes at Prairie Meadows before being transferring to Russell, who has sent him to the post five times.

With 25 starts over five seasons, Whereshetoldmetogo holds a record of 10-5-2 and earnings of \$586,291.

Bred by David Wade, the Not For Love winner is out of Undisputed Legend, a daughter of Domestic Dispute who has produced eight foals—her first five are all winners. Undisputed Legend's youngest is a 2-year-old by Great Notion named Rominski. The mare delivered a colt by Mendelssohn Feb. 12 and is back in foal to Vekoma.

MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS

I Get It collects first stakes win in Gulfstream's Sanibel Island

Gary Barber's aptly named I Get It got it in the \$100,000 Sanibel Island Stakes at Gulfstream Park March 27, as she went from last to first in a rally down the stretch in the race for 3-year-old fillies.

It was I Get It's first stakes victory, but she'd been competitive in two previous tries. Exactly one month earlier, she made her graded debut in Gulfstream's Grade 3 Herecomesthebride, was

bumped and pinched along the rail but re-rallied to be fourth. She was elevated to third after the winner was disqualified and placed behind her.

Sent off the 5-2 second choice in the Sanibel Island, the Ronald Spatz trainee broke from post seven and was the early trailer behind opening fractions of :24.64 and :49.08. I Get It made her move around the final turn as Jose Ortiz hus-

tled her to the outside after 6 furlongs in 1:13.21. She caught the leaders in the final furlong and pulled away to win by a half-length while after a mile on the turf in 1:36.11.

"My plan was to save ground on the first turn and try to keep her clear on the second turn and not get her in trouble," said Ortiz. "I was just waiting for the spot to go. The pace wasn't very hot so I wasn't able to drop in all the way. When I made my move,

she responded very good. She has a beautiful turn of foot."

I Get It improved to 5-0-1 from nine starts, while boosting her earnings to \$156,278. Barber purchased the filly after the Herecomesthebride.

"I can't even describe it, because I really thought she could have won last time," said Spatz. "If she'd have gotten through the hole or had a better trip, I think she could have won that race. The graded [win] would have meant a

lot for her, and she got graded [placed] anyway, so we're happy with that."

Bought by Spatz for \$8,500 as a yearling at the 2019 OBS October sale, the blaze-faced daughter of the equally flashy Get Stormy has raced exclusively on the turf. She debuted last July at Gulfstream and finished fifth in a roughly run 5 furlongs. Two starts later she broke her maiden by 5 lengths at a mile while risked for a \$40,000 tag. She followed with back-to-back allowance

victories at Gulfstream Park West (the old Calder Race Course)—at a mile in October, and 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles Nov. 28, her final start of the year which included a historic footnote, as it was the final card at the south Florida track after a nearly 50-year run.

I Get It returned Jan. 2 for her 3-year-old debut in Gulfstream Park's Ginger Brew, rallying from last to finish fourth, and two and a half weeks later scored by 3 lengths in a starter for fillies who had raced for

a claiming price of \$40,000 or less.

"We're real proud of her. We bought her as a yearling, when she was kind of small and weedy-looking. I love Get Stormy, so we took a shot with her. You can't measure their heart when they're young, and she's just got a huge heart," said Spatz.

Bred by Flying H Stables, owned by Kent and Tracy Hersman of Paris, Ky., I Get It—given the nickname "Snapchat" at the farm as a young-

ster because of her unique facial markings—is the first foal for the General Quarters' mare Twisted Beauty, sent to Maryland to foal at Angie and Sabrina Moore's GreenMount Farm in Glyndon in 2018.

Kent Hersman found and followed Sabrina on Instagram and liked her operation, including sales prep, and contacted her via the social network about sending a mare. "Out of anywhere I've ever boarded out of state, [Sabrina] is the best," said Hersman. 🐾
